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RULES and REGULATIONS GOVERNING TRANSFER PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP 2025 – 2026

- 1. Transfer President's Scholarships are offered to an elite group of transfer students who have demonstrated outstanding academic performance. These students have earned:
 - A cumulative transfer grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.7 on a 4.0 scale.
 - A minimum of 24 completed, transferable credits (non-remedial coursework).

The Transfer President's Scholarship is the value of full in-state tuition. To retain this scholarship, the student must:

- A. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25.
- B. Enroll as a full-time student each semester (minimum of 12 credits).
- C. Be in good standing (academic and conduct) and maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.25 as measured at the end of each academic year for the duration of eligibility.
 - i. Accepting the scholarship authorizes this office to request confirmation of good conduct standing from the Office of Student Conduct and Integrity.
- 2. Scholars will attend Leadership Meetings during their first year. They will meet with University and Terre Haute Community leaders who will lead discussion on topics from their professional and academic experiences. These mandatory meetings are held Tuesday nights at 7:00 p.m.
- 3. The Transfer President's Scholarship is good for a total of 6 consecutive semesters of enrollment*, or until a student earns his/her first undergraduate degree, whichever comes first.
 - * Enrolling full-time in a summer term will count as one of the 6 semesters of eligibility. Summer use of this scholarship requires submission of an appeal form in The Branch **prior** to the desired semester of use.
- 4. A student who withdraws or discontinues enrollment for one or more semesters may request renewal for a future semester by submitting an appeal before the withdrawal or discontinuation. The appeal form is available at <u>indianastate.edu/thebranch</u>, and can be best found by searching "Scholarship Appeal Form." The appeal should include the reason(s) for withdrawal and the semester he/she is planning to re-enroll. Students who withdraw or discontinue full-time yearly enrollment without submitting a written appeal and getting approval for the reinstatement of the scholarship will forfeit their award. Once the scholarship is lost, it cannot be reinstated.
- 5. Semesters in which a student enrolls are charged against the offer regardless of completion of classes, incomplete grades, or no grades.
- 6. Scholars are expected to annually volunteer for approximately 15 hours of community service. The goal is to do outreach within the community to improve societal issues and contribute to the public good. Details on how to record these hours are available on the Scholarships Student Root site.
