Report of the Faculty Senate Chairperson

Good morning. Usually at this time of year, our calendars are full of celebrations, and given how hard we have all worked to ensure the success of our students during these challenging times, it seems rather anticlimactic that we are nearly at the end of the semester. We look forward to hopefully being able to celebrate more with each other this Fall.

The pandemic has brought us many challenges; but as I said at the President's Fall Address, we must look for the opportunities in these challenges. Now admittedly, these current challenges were not the ones I had in mind back in September. However, the principle remains the same. The Faculty Senate has had to be quite nimble and flexible since mid-March. On March 19, we held out first virtual meeting ever. I am not certain I have ever been so nervous about a Senate meeting, but it worked, and by now, meeting online almost feels normal. That was the Thursday before Spring Break, and so much has happened since then at such a break-neck pace it has been hard to keep up. We have benefited from having an administration that recognizes the areas of primary authority of the faculty. When it came to the issue of the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grading option, it was brought to us in recognition of that authority. Other administrations in other times and places might have chosen to ignore faculty governance, but that did not happen here. But then it was on us to find a way to get a Senate vote on the matter in an exigent way over Spring Break, without violating at least the spirit of the Handbook. It wasn't a perfectly smooth process, but we have learned from the experience and have worked to find ways to regularize electronic participation, and have made contingency plans in case we need to take quick action over the summer or into the Fall.

One major accomplishment this year was the passage of the replacement for the Faculty Biennial Review (the Faculty Performance Evaluation Procedures that you have in front of you today). This new process will require much less work on a regular basis for most faculty, both in terms of submitting materials to be reviewed and in terms of faculty committees performing reviews. In short, full reviews will now happen only every three years, with expedited reviews in the other two years. All of the hassles of creating reports in the FAD have been eliminated, as has the mandatory training for all reviewers, which I had previously been in charge of writing and executing for both of the last two biennia.

Back in February, I mentioned the Taskforce that we hoped would begin meeting this semester to work on transforming the institution for the future. Then the pandemic came, and in light of all the changes we have been dealing with, it looks like the earliest the Taskforce on Institutional Transformation will meet is this summer. We have not given up on this, but the institution clearly is already adapting in ways that we were only beginning to consider at the start of this semester.

One of the most tiring aspect of the current crisis has been the lack of certainty, regarding, well, almost everything. One area of most concern, of course, is the budget. There is still much that could happen between now and the Fall which could impact it, and there are few certainties. Many important decisions will be made in the coming months, and Senate officers need to be in a position to communicate the sentiments of the faculty to the administration in a timely fashion. For that reason, we created a survey with everything we could possibly think of regarding priorities and potential cuts. Nearly 500 people responded, and they answered seriously and conscientiously. Faculty were clear that instruction (both undergraduate and graduate) is our core priority as an institution. They were willing to put on the table items that affect themselves, and not just others, such as sabbaticals, small programs, and summer teaching compensation. Very few were willing to impact students (directly or indirectly) or staff. So, if the budget projections turn grim, I would ask that we focus on our core mission.

We continue to advocate for a cautious, intentional, thoughtful return to campus. We realize that the most high-risk groups for covid-19 are amongst the faculty and staff. So, we are working with the administration to figure out ways that employees in high risk groups or those who live with people in high risk groups can delay returning to campus. We value everyone's health as a top priority.

Finally, we have had our elections, and Liz Brown will be Faculty Senate Chair next year, Keri Yousif will be Vice-Chair, and Bob Guell will be Secretary. We have had a great team of officers this year, and I am grateful to Bob Guell and Kent Games for all the support and advice, as well as the just plain hard work they have done this year. It has been an honor to get to serve in this role this year, but I am happy to yield my seat. Thank you.

Report of the Staff Council Chairperson

Good morning everyone. As is the case with other campus organizations, the majority of the time since our last meeting has been, for most of us, spent working at home. This meant our spring fundraising events and other staff engagement events were cancelled.

Despite these cancellations and working from home, the Staff Council has done its best to push forward. This includes committees working virtually such as the Staff Emergency Fund Committee which, prior to the crisis had been working on a process and criteria to award funds to staff in need during a time like this. We also had members of the Staff Council along with some cabinet members record a video of thanks to the staff at ISU who have been working on campus while the rest of us work from home. I wanted to publically thank Roxanne Torrence for making that video a reality.

With our annual meeting cancelled, we are delaying the Staff Council awards until the fall, so I will share the award winners during our next meeting and we will honor them in person, once we are able to.

We held elections yesterday, May 6th and I am pleased to announce that our executive committee for the next academic year is Roxanne Torrence returning as our Secretary, Jamie Hays returning as our Treasurer, Morgan Leek as our Vice Chair and I will be returning as the Staff Council Chair. I plan on selecting the rest of our executive committee in the coming week and we will begin planning for the summer and fall knowing we will be meeting virtually to begin. I want to thank those who served on Staff Council this year, especially those who served on our executive team. We accomplished much this year and collaboration was and will continue to be key.

Looking to the future, I am excited to lead the Staff Council another year and know we have our work cut out for us, but we are confident that the Staff Council in collaboration with University leadership will be very successful this coming year.

Lastly, I am honored and excited to be working alongside each of you for another year. Thank you!

Report of the Student Government Association President

Report of the Vice President for Advancement and CEO of the ISU Foundation

Good morning everyone! Thank you for allowing me to provide you and update on the activities, priorities, and results from the Division of University Advancement. For a division that is typically focused on working away from home and our office, these last couple of months have been a complete 180 for us. However, we have stayed focused, shifting to virtual meetings and phone calls to continue the momentum of our team. To celebrate our spring graduates and recognize this is not quite the final semester they had planned, the Alumni Association provided a complementary one-year annual membership to all graduates. Notification of their membership was included in the graduation boxes sent to seniors.

The second-annual Give to Blue Day was nothing short of amazing. Under the leadership of Director of Annual Giving, Hilary Duncan, Associate Vice President Jeremiah Turner and Executive Director of Stewardship & Constituent Engagement, Kim Kunz, expectations were exceeded again this year. I am pleased to report that \$679,274 dollars was raised from 2,418 generous donors. Included in our total were 541 student donors, 1,052 faculty and staff donors and 1,337 alumni donors. Donors from 48 of the 50 states and countries around the world including Saudi Arabia, Ukraine, India and Australia. I would like to thank a number of internal and external groups that contributed to the success of Give to Blue Day:

• The ISU Foundation Board of Directors whose members and emeriti members accounted for 39% of all dollars raised on Give to Blue Day.

• The ISU Student Philanthropy Group. Led by Kimmie Collins and Anne Bowen, this group of students is creating a culture of philanthropy for the next generation of Sycamores.

• Our campus partners – Our Deans, my cabinet colleagues, our faculty and staff campaign and Give to Blue Day campaign committees came together for another amazing day.

Please mark your calendar now the 2021 version of Give to Blue Day set for March 3.

I am pleased to report our annual and endowed scholarship and fund distributions to campus for the 2020-2021 academic year. For the upcoming year, **more than \$3.1 million** in donor-funded scholarships and endowed programs will be available to the university. This represents a **24 percent increase** in endowment distributions and annual scholarship funding from the previous fiscal year. We continue to prioritize fundraising for Bridge the Gap Scholarships. Next year, \$192,153 is available for Bridge the Gap scholarships. This represents funding is from nine designated, 6 of which are endowed and 3 that are annual awards.

Finally, on the performance front, I am pleased to report on our private giving contributions through April 2020, 10 months into our fiscal year. The Division of University Advancement has raised \$9.8 Million Dollars through gifts of cash, pledges, and gifts in kind or planned giving commitments. This is an increase of 23% from the same 10-month period last year. Gifts have been made by 6,287 distinct donors. We have seen a marked increase in gifts to our endowment, with more than \$2.5 million in new gifts to the endowment this fiscal year as compared to \$1 million in endowment gifts last year.

Thank you for the opportunity to present the work of the Division of University Advancement to you today.

Report of the University President

(COVID-19)

- As everyone is aware, the University has been greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic but we have remained open and are fulfilling our mission due to the hard work of our extraordinary faculty and staff.
 - They have not missed a beat during this crisis and have acted quickly to move to online instruction, advising, counseling, tutoring, administrative work, and much more.
- Several important events have also been moved online including
 - o Commencement,
 - o the SAMy awards recognizing our hard-working student athletes,
 - o the annual University Memorial Service,
 - o the STATE Start-Up summer orientation program, and
 - o several other recognition and year-end celebrations.
- I am particularly saddened that we had to pivot to our virtual Commencement ceremony.
 - Our commencement days are my two favorite days of the year as we celebrate the ultimate measure of student success – earning a degree.
- However, I was pleased to assist last week with stuffing more than 2,000 specialized ISU boxes filled with
 - o a mortar board,
 - o tassel,
 - o lapel pin,
 - o Commencement program,
 - o diploma cover,
 - o one-year free membership to the Alumni Association,
 - \circ any honor cords or stoles the student had earned, and
 - o a special invitation to our virtual online commencement ceremony.
- In addition, we have invited these students to participate in the December Commencement.
 - o This effort took a great deal of work, and I would particularly like to recognize
 - o Jennifer Keller, the Provost's Executive Assistant, and
 - Susan Powers, associate vice president for academic affairs, for their hard work in organizing it.

- Our students are the beneficiaries of the can-do attitude that our faculty and staff have demonstrated in adapting to this environment.
 - We are so proud of them, and deeply appreciate the monumental effort this has taken on so many fronts.
- At this point, I would like to call upon Provost Mike Licari to share some additional information regarding this unusual spring semester.

(Provost Licari reported on the move to online instruction following spring break and the decision to provide students with the option of receiving Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grades for the spring term.)

President Curtis:

- Thank you, Mike.
- At the same time that many are working remotely, there are also those who are essential staff who are keeping our campus operational.
 - Our marketing office has developed a series that recognizes and celebrates these individuals for helping us during these unusual times.
 - At this point, I would like to share a quick run-through of the first phase of this series.

(Slides depicting workers from various units who have continued to work on campus to provide essential services.)

- Thank you to all of these individuals and their colleagues who serve as essential staff.
 - Their work is critical to maintaining university operations, and they do this work with such dignity and care.
- I would also like to take a moment to recognize the outstanding leadership provided by Governor Eric Holcomb during this time and
 - express our appreciation to our local legislators, including Senator Jon Ford who reached out personally to check in and continue his advocacy on our behalf.
 - Our state's congressional delegation has also been supportive.
 - I was pleased to speak with Congressman Larry Buschon about the pandemic's impact, and heard from Senator Todd Young's office as well.
 - Our elected officials are doing vital work to address this challenge.
 - We are particularly grateful for the CARES Act funding and
 - were pleased to begin distributing \$3.12 million in grants to our students impacted by the pandemic this week.
- Our students have also done an impressive job of adjusting including many who have worked to overcome significant challenges.
 - I was particularly heartened by a note I received this week from a faculty member indicating how impressed she has been by her students and their reactions to the move to online instruction.

- She mentioned one student who apologized last week for a paper being a day late.
- She explained that this was the first she had learned that he had no internet at home and has, since mid-March, been driving his truck to a parking lot where he could connect to WIFI to complete his work.
- This determination is a hallmark of so many of our students.
- While at the present time most university employees continue to work remotely, ISU remains open for business.
- To move forward, our leadership team has been designing a plan to engage the ISU campus community in developing steps for phased-in summer operations.
 - We will be devising phase-in scenarios to cover the next several months that align with the Governor's Back on Track plans.
 - Our "Sycamores Back on Track" planning begins today as Senior Vice President McKee will engage with the leadership of the Staff Council on a summer phase-in process
 - Plans will be made for staff to begin phasing back to campus over the next several weeks since summer courses will be delivered almost entirely online.
 - These first steps are a small part of the larger "Sycamores Back on Track" process that will be evolving over the next several weeks.
 - As we endeavor to engage our campus community, safety remains our top priority.
 - Next week, as they are developed, we will post documents related to this planning process.
 - As we phase in summer operations, the university will be taking numerous steps to enhance safety.
 - It is important to note, however, that these plans may change as the situation evolves.
 - These processes may be subject to change based upon Federal and State guidelines should that guidance be modified.
- Of course, other factors may impact how we will define the specifics for each process such as
 - o directives from the governor or
 - Decisions made by the NCAA, or the Missouri Valley Conference and others.
- Rest assured, these decisions will be made carefully and with collaboration throughout campus.
 - The plans will be communicated broadly as specifics can be defined.

- On today's agenda, the Board will be approving the budget for the upcoming fiscal year.
 - The budget presented today is based upon financial assumptions formed at the end of February.
 - Those assumptions include estimates of state support and tuition and fee revenue (based on enrollment projections), among other revenue sources.
 - All of us recognize that those assumptions undoubtedly may change in the coming weeks as more information becomes available regarding state funding and enrollment.
 - Any material reductions in revenue for the next fiscal year will likely result in reduced expenditures as well.
- Our mission to deliver a high-quality educational experience to prepare the workforce of Indiana and beyond is unwavering.
 - Our university is resilient and has faced many challenges during its long history including
 - wars,
 - the Great Depression,
 - the fire of 1888 and
 - others.
 - Knowing how this university has overcome those formidable hardships, I am confident we will overcome this one as well.

(First Destination Survey)

- And now to close my report, here is some very positive news.
 - I would like to call on Dr. Nancy Rogers, Vice President for University Engagement, to share a report on the First-Destination Survey results for the Class of 2019.

(Vice President Rogers reported on the results of the First Destination survey which indicated that 99 percent of the Class of 2019 graduates were either working, attending graduate school or serving in the military within six months of graduation.)

President Curtis:

- Thank you, Dr. Rogers.
- While the coronavirus pandemic has created challenges for many members of the Class of 2020,
 - we are confident that our faculty members have guided them in the development of the skills and knowledge they will need to be successful,
 - o particularly as the economy is restarted.

Report of the Board Chair

Thank you Dr. Curtis. Before I begin my report, I would like to express a couple of kudos. Provost Mike Licari please pass along to Dr. Linda Maule and her team our congratulations on those first-year retention rates, those are marvelous. The great thing about freshmen is after one year, they become sophomores. It sounds like you're doing a great job with that conversion. Dr. Nancy Rogers, those employment numbers were just astounding, thank you so much.

The Trustees met last on February 21st just 11 weeks ago. Even the most vivid or morbid imaginations among us could not begin to conjure up what has happened to us in that short time. Seventy odd thousand deaths, from record economic prosperity to record unemployment and on college campuses across the country from visions of spring break to no such travel to everybody go home. During the month of March it seems as though we were in a free-fall of bad news from this pandemic. But through it all Dr. Curtis assured me her team was not going to let it stop us. Classes would go online, we will finish the semester, and seniors will graduate. Easy to say and even easier for me to hear, but I know that making this happen was nothing but hard work and ingenuity. I sit here today with a certain amount of amazement that we pulled it off. Two thousand and fifty degrees will be conferred this month, not in the way we thought they would have been and that is a deep disappointment to all of us, but completed and conferred none the less. Those still working toward degrees will complete semester coursework and stay on track. On behalf of the entire board I want to express our sincere thanks to the administration, faculty, staff and learners whose dedication, hard work and can do attitude made it happen in spite of it all. We know it wasn't easy, and we thank you from the bottom of our Sycamore hearts. So savor the success for a minute and perhaps enjoy some downtime this summer and then contemplate the fall. In my view, this fall is going to be three times harder than the spring just behind us. Returning faculty and students to campus, opening campus housing and dining and classrooms in a safe and secure way will again require all our ingenuity and more hard work. A thousand problems to solve between now and then and guess what -- it won't go all as planned. I know you will once again rise to the huge challenge and in fact look forward to it because it represents renewal, restoration and a return mostly to ISU campus life that we've always known. Godspeed and best of luck to all and with that positive thought on to the agenda.

3a Suspension of Bylaws

Today, we are meeting virtually via electronic means. Governor Eric Holcomb declared a public health emergency on March 6, 2020 as a result of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). Executive Order 20-09, which remains in effect, waives the restrictions on electronic meetings in Indiana's Open Door Law and authorizes governing bodies of public agencies to meet by videoconference or by telephone conferencing so long as a quorum of members participate and the meeting is made available to the public and media.

The bylaws of the ISU Board of Trustees include the same restrictions on electronic participation in meetings as the Indiana Open Door Law. Specifically, bylaw Section 125.4.1.4 requires meetings held via electronic communication to have:

- At least three members physically present;
- Only one agenda item; and
- Votes to be taken by roll call.

We need to address the application of this bylaw for meetings held during the course of this public health emergency to align with Gov. Holcomb's executive order.

In addition, the bylaws include provisions for Special Meetings with five days' notice. Indiana's Open Door Law only requires 48 hours' notice for a meeting of a public agency.

Therefore, I move that the Board of Trustees suspend Bylaw Section 125.4.1.4 that governs participation by electronic communication along with Bylaw Section 125.4.1.3.1 to allow for 48-hours' notice for any Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees for the duration of the public health emergency declared by Governor Holcomb on March 6, 2020.

3g1Series T Bond Resolution

The University is preparing for the sale of new bonds to finance the renovation of the Dreiser Hall facility as approved by the 2019 Indiana General Assembly. The total project cost is not to exceed \$18,400,000. The proposed bond issue, to be designated Series T, is entirely feereplaced debt.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY BOARD OF TRUSTEES APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF THE INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY STUDENT FEE BONDS, SERIES T

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Indiana State University Board of Trustees (the "University") has full power and authority under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Indiana, including, more particularly, the provisions of Indiana Code 21-34-1 et seq., to issue bonds to finance or refinance academic and building facilities on its campus in Terre Haute, Indiana, such bonds to be secured by Student Fees; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that a necessity exists to consider financing all or a portion of the costs of the acquisition, construction, expansion, renovation and equipping of certain academic and building facilities on the University's campus in Terre Haute, Indiana, as described in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the University has heretofore executed and delivered to First Financial Bank, N.A. (formerly known as Terre Haute First National Bank), as trustee (the "Trustee"), a certain Trust Indenture dated as of November 1, 1985, as heretofore supplemented and amended (the "Indenture"), for the purpose of securing its Indiana State University Student Fee Bonds (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Bonds"), issued from time to time thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer of the University (the "Treasurer") has investigated, developed and evaluated a Plan of Financing (the "Plan of Financing") for financing all or a portion of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to authorize the Treasurer to effectuate such Plan of Financing for financing all or a portion of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, Article IV of the Indenture authorizes the issuance of additional series of Bonds by the University and the authentication and delivery of those additional series of Bonds by the Trustee under the conditions set forth in Article IV, which conditions have been complied with (subject to approval by the State Budget Committee and the State Budget Director of the State of Indiana) so as to authorize the issuance, authentication and delivery of an additional series of Bonds by the Trustee under the conditions set forth in Article IV, to provide the funds required to finance all or a portion of the costs of the Project, as well as certain related costs incidental to the financing; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to authorize the execution and delivery of the Indiana State University Student Fee Bonds, Series T (the "Series T Bonds"), and a Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture (the "Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture"), a Construction and Rebate Agreement (the "Rebate Agreement"), a Preliminary Official Statement (the "Official Statement"), a final Official Statement, a Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Bond Purchase Agreement"), a Second Amended and Restated Continuing Disclosure Undertaking Agreement (the "Restated Undertaking Agreement"), forms of the Series T Bonds, and any further documents required to complete the execution and delivery of the Series T Bonds (subject to any approvals as may be required from the State Budget Committee and the State Budget Director of the State of Indiana); and

WHEREAS, there has now been made available to the Board a form of Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, a form of Rebate Agreement, a form of Official Statement, a form of Bond Purchase Agreement and a form of Restated Undertaking Agreement in connection with the issuance of the Series T Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$18,400,000, plus additional amounts needed for underwriter's discount as described below and any original issue discount or bond premium, as permitted by law, capitalized interest (if any), costs of issuance, any amounts necessary to provide for any debt service reserve fund, and costs of any premiums for bond or debt service reserve fund insurance; and

WHEREAS, the Board now desires to authorize and direct the Treasurer to do any and all acts and things, to seek all necessary approvals from the State Budget Committee and the State Budget Director of the State of Indiana, and to make and approve all changes in form or substance to the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Rebate Agreement, the Restated Undertaking Agreement or the Official Statement, necessary to secure approval of the transaction contemplated herein by any rating agency, bond insurer, reserve fund surety bond provider, or the State of Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the University intends to acquire, construct, equip, renovate and/or rehabilitate the various components of the Project, and reasonably expects to reimburse certain costs of the Project with proceeds of debt to be incurred by the University; and

WHEREAS, the University expects to issue debt not exceeding \$18,400,000 in aggregate principal amount for purposes of financing, refinancing or reimbursing all or a portion of the costs of the Project, plus additional amounts needed for costs of issuance, any debt service reserve fund, costs of any premiums for bond or debt service reserve fund insurance, underwriter's discount and original issue discount/bond premium as provided by law, capitalized interest (if any), and other incidental costs as required by the issue;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Plan of Financing investigated, developed and evaluated by the Treasurer is hereby approved and the Treasurer is hereby authorized to effectuate the Plan of Financing with respect to financing all or a portion of the costs of the Project.

<u>Section 2.</u> The issuance of the Series T Bonds by the University on the terms and conditions set forth in the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture is hereby authorized in the total principal amount not to exceed \$18,400,000, plus additional amounts needed for underwriter's discount as described below and original issue discount or bond premium, as permitted by law, capitalized interest (if any), costs of issuance, any amounts necessary to provide for any debt service reserve fund, and costs of any premiums for bond or debt service reserve fund insurance. The Series T Bonds shall be designated the "Indiana State University Board of Trustees, Indiana State University Student Fee Bonds, Series T." The true interest cost of the Series T Bonds shall not exceed 4.00%, with a maximum underwriters' discount of 1.00%, and with such serial or term maturities and redemption features as the executing officers shall approve. The final maturity of the Series T Bonds shall not extend beyond October 1, 2040. The Series T Bonds shall be sold pursuant to the Bond Purchase Agreement at negotiated sale to a managing underwriter and comanaging underwriter(s) as selected and appointed pursuant to Section 12 below.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to do any and all acts and things, to seek all necessary approvals from the State Budget Committee and the State Budget Director of the State of Indiana, and to make and approve all changes in form or substance to the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Rebate Agreement, the Restated Undertaking Agreement or the Official Statement necessary to secure approval of the transaction contemplated herein by any rating agency, bond insurer, reserve fund surety bond provider, or the State of Indiana.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to the Board and is made a part of this Resolution as if fully set forth herein. The Chair and the Vice Chair of the University (the "Chair" and the "Vice Chair," respectively), or either of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, and the Secretary and the Assistant Secretary of the University (the "Secretary" and the "Assistant Secretary", respectively), or either of them, are hereby authorized to attest the signature of and to imprint the corporate seal of the University on the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture in substantially the form presented to the Board, with those changes in form or substance that the Treasurer, and the officers executing the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

<u>Section 5.</u> The Official Statement is approved in substantially the form submitted to the Board and is made a part of this Resolution as if fully set forth herein. The Treasurer is hereby

authorized and directed to make those changes in form or substance as are necessary or appropriate, to authorize the distribution of the Official Statement, to deem an Official Statement to be final or nearly final for purposes of applicable Securities and Exchange Commission rules, to execute and deliver the form of any final Official Statement with those changes in form or substance that the Treasurer shall approve, and to cause printed copies of the Preliminary and final Official Statements to be provided to those prospective purchasers, investors and other persons as he may deem advisable in order to market the Series T Bonds, and any such prior actions are hereby ratified and confirmed.

<u>Section 6.</u> The Bond Purchase Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to the Board and is made a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein. The Chair, Vice Chair and Treasurer, or any of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Bond Purchase Agreement in substantially the form submitted to the Board, with those changes in form or substance that the Treasurer, and the officers executing the Bond Purchase Agreement, shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

<u>Section 7.</u> The Rebate Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to the Board and is made a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein. The Chair, Vice Chair and Treasurer, or any of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, and the Secretary or Assistant Secretary, or either of them, is hereby authorized to attest the signature of and to imprint the corporate seal of the University on, the Rebate Agreement in substantially the form submitted to the Board, with those changes in form or substance that the Treasurer, and the officers executing the Rebate Agreement, shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

<u>Section 8.</u> The Restated Undertaking Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form submitted to the Board and is made a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully herein. The Chair, Vice Chair, and Treasurer, or any of them, are hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Undertaking Agreement in substantially the form submitted to the Board, with those changes in form or substance that the Treasurer, and the officers executing the Restated Undertaking Agreement, shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

Section 9. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to prepare the bond forms required for use in the issuance of the Series T Bonds, on the terms and conditions set forth in the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, and to cause the same to be executed manually or by facsimile by the proper officers of the University as provided in the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture. Upon execution of the Series T Bonds, the Treasurer shall deliver the Series T Bonds to the Trustee for authentication, and upon their authentication, the Treasurer is authorized and directed to deliver the Series T Bonds to the purchasers thereof on payment of the purchase price, which price shall reflect the underwriter's discount permitted by this Resolution and original issue discount or bond premium, if any, as permitted by law.

<u>Section 10.</u> The Chair, Vice Chair, President of the University (the "President"), Treasurer, Secretary and Assistant Secretary, or any of them acting singly or jointly, are hereby authorized and directed to do any and all further acts and things necessary underlying the execution and delivery of such additional or supporting agreements, documents or certificates as may be requested or necessary in order to complete the transactions contemplated by the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Seventeenth Supplemental Indenture, the Rebate Agreement, the Restated Undertaking Agreement and the Official Statement hereby authorized. Section 11. The Board hereby approves the Treasurer to make the necessary calculations with respect to the coverage factor of Student Fees to Maximum Annual Debt Service, after the pricing of the Series T Bonds, to be shown in the Official Statement for the Series T Bonds.

Section 12. The Board hereby ratifies the selection of, and appoints, Piper Sandler Companies as underwriter for the Series T Bonds, and further authorizes the Treasurer in her discretion to select one or more additional co-managing underwriters for the Series T Bonds (or none at all). The Board hereby ratifies the selection of, and appoints, (i) Ice Miller LLP as bond counsel for the Series T Bonds, and (ii) Blue Rose Capital Advisors, LLC as municipal advisor for the Series T Bonds.

Section 13. The use of bond insurance is hereby approved in connection with the Series T Bonds, if deemed beneficial to the University in the best judgment of the Treasurer. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to select a bond insurer, if deemed beneficial at her discretion and using her best judgment, and to accept any commitments and execute any agreements which may be necessary or advisable in connection with any such bond insurance for the Series T Bonds.

<u>Section 14.</u> The Board hereby declares its official intent to acquire, construct, equip and/or rehabilitate the Project described in <u>Exhibit A</u>; to reimburse certain costs of acquiring, constructing, equipping and/or rehabilitating the Project with proceeds of debt to be incurred by the University; and to issue debt not exceeding \$18,400,000 in aggregate principal amount for purposes of financing, refinancing or reimbursing all or a portion of the costs of the Project, plus additional amounts needed for costs of issuance, any debt service reserve fund, costs of any premiums for bond or debt service reserve fund insurance, underwriter's discount and original issue discount/bond premium as provided by law, capitalized interest (if any), and other incidental costs as required by the issue.

<u>EXHIBIT A</u>

THE PROJECT

The Project consists of the acquisition, construction, expansion, renovation and equipping of certain facilities of the University on its Terre Haute campus, including, in particular, Academic Facility Renovation - Phase II for the renovation of Dreiser Hall, including replacement of critical building components (HVAC, plumbing, fire suppression, and electrical) and improvement of ADA accessibility.

The Project has a total cost not expected to exceed \$18,400,000, to be financed in whole by the Series T Bonds. The Series T Bonds will be eligible for fee replacement. Browning Day Mullins Dierdorf of Indianapolis, Indiana is the architect for the Project. Work on the Project will begin in Summer 2020 and is scheduled for completion in October 2021.

3h1 Proposed Modifications to Policy 955 Campus Tobacco

Rationale: President Curtis created the ISU Tobacco Free Task Force in September 2018 following increasing concerns regarding vaping and the use of electronic smoking devices on campus. The task force completed its work and issued a report in April 2019. The task force considered data, including the results of a survey to ISU students, faculty, and staff in which two-thirds of respondents supported a tobacco-free policy. In fall of 2019, the President asked each governance unit to solicit feedback on the report from their constituents and as a result of that feedback proposes this policy modification. Senate would like the smoking shacks to remain the same. The draft policy was provided to the Board of Trustees for information in February and this policy is being provided to the Board of Trustees for action.

Proposed Language:

955 Campus Tobacco, Vapor, and Smoke Free Campus

955.1 Overview of Policy

Indiana State University has a commitment is committed to the health and wellness of its students, faculty, and staff. This commitment is demonstrated by the Student Health Promotion and Student Recreation Center-Campus Recreation programs coordinated by the Division of Student Affairs, by the efforts of the Employee Assistance Program coordinated through the Office of Human Resources, and by curricula and activities in several academic units throughout the University.

955.1.1 Indiana Law Sets Minimum Standards. Documented research has substantiated the health problems caused by both electronic smoking devices, hookah, smoking, tobacco products, and passive smoke, smoking and passive smoke. The General Assembly of the State of Indiana adopted the Indiana Clean Indoor Air Law which is applicable to all state entities in order to address concern for the health and wellness of all Indiana government employees and students. This law sets forth minimum standards but allows state agencies to adopt more stringent rules if desired. Both the City of Terre Haute and Vigo County have passed ordinances that prohibit or limit smoking in public places and places of employment. The U.S. government has enacted restrictions on the sale of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, and other devices in recognition of the health risks associated with smoke and tobacco products.

955.1.2 Applicability. Indiana State University has established the following policy regarding smoking for all facilities and vehicles in which University functions or services are carried out or offered.

955.2 Definitions.

955.2.1 "Electronic Smoking Device" means any product containing or delivering nicotine or any other substance intended for human consumption that can be used by a person in any manner for the purpose of inhaling vapor or aerosol from the product. The term includes any such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an ecigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, e-hookah, or vape pen, or under any other product name or descriptor.

<u>955.2.2 "Hookah" means a water pipe and any associated products and devices used to produce fumes, smoke, and/or vapor from the burning of material, including but not limited to, tobacco, shisha, or other plant matter.</u>

955.2.3 "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, hookah, or any other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation, including marijuana, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or in any form. "Smoking" also includes the use of an electronic smoking device, which creates an aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking in this Policy.

955.2.4 "Tobacco Product" means any substance containing tobacco leaf, including but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, hookah tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco, dipping tobacco, bidis, blunts, clove cigarettes, or any other preparation of tobacco; and any product or formulation of matter containing biologically active amounts of nicotine that is manufactured, sold, offered for sale, or otherwise distributed with the expectation that the product or matter will be introduced into the human body by inhalation; but does not include any cessation product specifically approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for use in treating nicotine or tobacco dependence.

955.32 Prohibition of Sales

The sale of <u>electronic smoking devices, hookah, smoking, and</u> tobacco products is prohibited on university-owned, operated, or leased property.

955.<u>4</u>3 Prohibition of <u>SmokingElectronic Smoking Devices</u>, <u>Hookah</u>, <u>Smoking</u>, <u>and</u> <u>Tobacco Product Use</u>.

The use of <u>electronic smoking devices, hookah, smoking, and tobacco products</u><u>smoking</u> tobacco products_ is prohibited on university-owned, operated, or leased property.

955.43.1 Exception for Private Vehicles and Designated Areas. The use of smoking tobacco products legal electronic smoking devices, hookah, smoking, and/or tobacco products is permitted in the enclosed cabin of privately owned vehicles and in designated smoking areas on campus. Designated smoking areas will be gradually phased out in a manner determined by the administration as use diminshes.

<u>955.4.2 Exception for Inhaler Devices for Medical Use.</u> Legal use of an inhaler device for medical purposes is not prohibited.

955.43.32 Other Exceptions. Any <u>other exceptions for the use of electronic smoking</u> <u>devices, hookah, smoking, and/or tobacco products smoking tobacco products on</u> university-owned, operated, or leased property <u>will be limited to specific university-</u> <u>sponsored research in a controlled laboratory setting or upon approval by the President.</u> <u>must be approved by the President or Provost.</u>

955.54 Enforcement

Enforcement of this policy will depend on the cooperation of all faculty, staff, and students not only to comply with the policy, but also to encourage others to comply, in order to promote a

healthy environment in which to work, study, and live. Peer ambassadors can assist with enforcement by providing policy education and connection to cessation resources to persons who violate the policy.

955.65 Violations

Policy violations may be reported to the ISU Police Department. ISU Police will forward alleged policy violations by employees to the Office of Human Resources for potential disciplinary action under Policy 562. Information about student violations of the policy will be referred to the Dean of Students for potential disciplinary action under the Code of Student Conduct. Observation of a violation of the policy should be reported to Public Safety at 5555. Follow up for violations of the policy should be referred to the appropriate administrative office for review and action for faculty through the office of Academic Affairs, for staff through Human Resources and to the Dean of Students for students

3h2 Proposed Policy 930 Sports Wagering

Rationale: In response to Indiana legislation allowing sports wagering to occur in Indiana, the administration proposes a policy that will prohibit employees from wagering on ISU intercollegiate athletic contests, athletic performances, or coaching performances. The purpose of the policy is to make clear ISU's commitment to student athletes and the University's expectation that employees embrace principles of integrity and ethical behavior. The proposed policy prohibits employees, including student employees and graduate students, from wagering on ISU Division 1 Intercollegiate athletic contest, players, and coaches. ISU student athletes, athletic department coaches, administrative staff, student staff, and others responsible for the administration of ISU's NCAA Division 1 program are prohibited from engaging in sports wagering by NCAA rule. The proposed policy is provided to the Trustees for information only.

Proposed Policy:

Policy 930 Sports Wagering

930.1 Commitment to Integrity and Fairness; Support of Student Athletes. Indiana State University is committed to integrity and fairness in all aspects of its participation in NCAA Division I Intercollegiate Athletics, the academic success of student athletes, and the promotion of student athlete health and well-being. ISU expects all ISU employees to embrace these principles of integrity and fairness, with a focus on student success.

930.2 Prohibition on Sports Wagering. ISU prohibits employees, including student employees and graduate assistants, from placing, accepting, or soliciting wagers on or related to Indiana State University NCAA Division I athletic contests. Sports Wagering is prohibited inperson, online, via mobile device, through any electronic mechanism, or via an intermediary.

930.2.1 Definition of wager. For purposes of this policy, the term "wager" refers to something (including money) risked on an uncertain event.

930.2.2 Definition of Sports Wagering. For purposes of this policy, the term "Sports Wagering" refers to the act of placing, accepting, or soliciting (on one's own behalf or on behalf of others) a wager on an ISU Division I intercollegiate athletic team, student athlete, or coach, whether in favor or against the team, student-athlete, or coach, at any time prior to or during an ISU athletic contest. For purposes of this policy, Sports Wagering does not include participation in paid fantasy sports.

930.2.3 NCAA or Conference Requirements. This policy does not limit NCAA or conference prohibitions on Sports Wagering or related requirements for ISU employees and students.

930.3 Violations of Policy. An employee determined to be in violation of this policy may be subject to employment discipline, up to and including termination. Termination will be reserved for repeated or egregious violations.

3k New Program Certificate in Emerging Technology

As Indiana coal plants convert to other energy forms, the workers in these electricity plants do not have the skills necessary to work on the electrical grid associated with different forms of energy generation. These workers risk being laid off from their current positions and do not possess the skills necessary to transition to other positions.

Hoosier Energy worked with the College of Technology to develop the course sequence that will give employees the needed skills to move to new positions within the company or to be competitive outside the company. Hoosier Energy is paying the tuition for the employees.

This 21-credit hour certificate program will be offered online and in 8 week course segments. The department of Applied Engineering and Technology Management, and the Math and Computer Science department worked with the faculty of Electronic Computer and Engineering to make any necessary course revisions and put the course sequence together.

The program will use CIP 15.0303, and this proposal will need to go forward the Indiana Commission of Higher Education for desk action.

3I New Program Computer Science Teaching Minor

The Computer Science Teaching minor focuses on (a) CS skills necessary to teach courses that are licensed in Indiana by the Computer Science license, (b) methods in CS teaching. CS skills that are developed include imperative programming, object-oriented programming, information technology software and hardware, and the fundamentals of computing. CS teaching students apply these skills to teaching scenarios for courses that are taught by K-12 Computer Educators in Indiana.

This minor, in conjunction with (a) a separate education major that grants a teaching license and (b) the appropriate state licensure test score, qualifies the student for a computer science teaching license. The minor without a teaching license does not satisfy requirements for teaching computing courses in the state.

The minor is being proposed in part due to a continuing lack of qualified teachers to teach CS in K-12, and a focus by the state of Indiana on improving CS teaching in K-12 and curriculum. The CS Teaching Minor could be attractive to either education majors in STEM areas (e.g., mathematics, science), or education majors for which teaching positions are particularly difficult to obtain.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, the Teacher Education Committee, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

3m Faculty Performance Evaluation Procedures

Approved by Executive Committee 3/17/2020 Approved by Faculty Senate 4/16/2020

Rationale

Faculty Performance Evaluations (FPE) are a means by which Indiana State University can assess and acknowledge the work of its faculty. Through the evaluation process, the institution can support faculty in their professional goals and demonstrate to external constituencies on an ongoing basis that ISU faculty meet professional standards of performance in all domains of their work. The faculty performance evaluation model is not a substitute for existing faculty dismissal processes. Neither is it meant to replicate the rigor of tenure/promotion processes and standards. This process is designed to be faculty driven and focused on professional growth.

Toward this end, all regular university faculty shall be evaluated annually and a record of that evaluation placed in their official personnel files. Pre-tenure faculty and instructors subject to annual review and faculty who were promoted effective August of year 3 of the review cycle will not be included in this process. In these, as in all faculty evaluative processes, Indiana State University subscribes to existing AAUP guidelines.

Overview

Each faculty member shall place into the Faculty Activities Database (FAD) evidence of their teaching/librarianship, scholarship/creative activity, and service activities by September 20 each year for the previous August 1-July 31 period. Each faculty member's performance will be evaluated for each assigned component (teaching/librarianship, scholarship/creativity, and service) annually. The individual categories will be designated *Meets Expectations* or *Does Not Meet Expectations*.

In Years 1 and 2 of the cycle they will be evaluated by their chair and dean, either of whom may trigger a review by the college personnel committee, which may then lead to a full review or not. In year 3, faculty will be evaluated by their department personnel committee and department chair in independent reviews.

Annual Data Entry

Each faculty member shall place into the Faculty Activities Database (FAD) evidence of their teaching/librarianship, scholarship/creative activity, and service activities by September 20 each year for the previous August 1-July 31 period. Evidence of teaching effectiveness must include, at a minimum, syllabi and the University-wide student course evaluations for any courses taught during the review period*. Faculty may include evidence providing support of effectiveness in other domains, but only the domains in which the faculty member has an assignment shall be considered relevant. Faculty who serve as chairpersons also may submit materials related to their administrative duties in the three faculty domains, as appropriate.

*Exempting those for Spring 2020

(It should be noted that faculty who serve as chairpersons undergo a separate, triennial evaluation of their administrative effectiveness. See Faculty Handbook, Section 350.4). Only

that portion of the chairperson's activities related to the faculty-specific domains shall be evaluated within the framework of the Faculty Performance Evaluation as described in this document.

Process for Years 1 and 2

Chair Review

Each year, after September 20, the chairperson/executive director shall review the faculty member's materials for the review period in the FAD and evaluate the faculty member's performance in each assigned area. This evaluation will include a rationale for a determination of not meeting expectations in any of the three faculty domains. The faculty member will be notified of the results of this evaluation by October 20.

Dean Review

Each year, after September 20, the Dean shall review the faculty member's materials for the review period in the FAD and evaluate the faculty member's performance in each assigned area. The Dean will also review department chairpersons in the three faculty domains. This evaluation will include a rationale for a determination of not meeting expectations in any of the three faculty domains. The faculty member will be notified of the results of this evaluation by November 10.

Outcomes of Chair and Dean Reviews

If both the chair and the Dean agree that the faculty member is meeting expectations in all three domains, the review is complete.

If they do not agree, then the college personnel committee shall determine by November 30, based on the faculty member's materials and the review by the chair and Dean whether a full review is required. If they determine that a full review is not required, the review process is complete.

If both the chair and the Dean agree that the faculty member is NOT meeting expectations in at least one of the three domains, a full review will be conducted.

Full Review

If a full review is required, the faculty member will have the opportunity to provide a one page narrative of no more than 3000 characters to explain, rebut, or appeal the finding of not meeting expectations. This narrative will be due no later than December 10.

A full review involves review by the departmental personnel committee, department chair, college personnel committee, and Dean. Each level of review will consider the narrative submitted by the faculty member along with the faculty member's FAD materials for the review period. The department personnel committee and chair will have their independent evaluations made by January 20 and will meet to reconcile any differences and forward their findings to the college by January 25. If the two evaluations are not reconciled, the college personnel committee and the Dean, working together, will make a final determination. When the department level evaluations are reconciled but the Dean disagrees with the evaluations, the college personnel committee will make a final determination. The review process must be completed no later than February 10.

Faculty who undergo a full review in year 1 or year 2 and are found to be meeting expectations in all faculty domains, may not receive their anticipated across-the-board pay increase in the same payroll that all faculty receive theirs'. Those impacted will receive those increases (current month and back pay) on the next monthly payroll.

Completed Review

Once the review process is complete, the chair shall meet with each faculty member within one month of the completion date to discuss the previous years' activities and goals for subsequent years.

Process for Year 3

Narrative

In every year 3, faculty have the option to submit a one page narrative that briefly summarizes their activities, with no more than 1000 characters (approx. 143 words) devoted to each domain of faculty work in the FAD.

Department Committee and Chair Review

The department committee *and* the department chairperson/executive director will independently read and evaluate the submitted materials for each faculty member. Department chairs will be evaluated by their department committee. The department committee and department chair will then meet together to discuss their evaluations and reconcile them if they disagree. Faculty who are chairing departments other than the department of their faculty status shall have their performance in the domains of faculty work assessed by their home department.

During this meeting, the chairperson/executive director may provide to the department committee official university data, peer or professional teaching evaluations, and/or sensitive personnel information documented in the faculty member's official personnel file (see Faculty Handbook, Section 570) that is germane to the review. Individual or collected student complaints shall not be inserted unless they have resulted in a letter of admonishment regarding deficient performance.

The department will complete the review process for each eligible faculty member and notify them of the results by October 31.

College Review

Each year 3, after September 20, the Dean shall review the faculty member's materials for the review period in the FAD and evaluate the faculty member's performance in each assigned area. The Dean will also review department chairpersons in the three faculty domains. This evaluation will include a rationale for a determination of not meeting expectations in any of the three faculty domains. The faculty member will be notified of the results of this evaluation by November 10.

Unreconciled Evaluations

When any of the domain-specific performance evaluations are not reconciled at the department level, the college personnel committee and the dean, working together will make a final determination. When the department level evaluations are reconciled but the Dean disagrees with the evaluations, the college personnel committee will make a final determination. The review process must be completed no later than December 10.

Completed Review

Once the review process is complete, the chair shall meet with each faculty member within one month of the completion date to discuss the previous years' activities and goals for subsequent years.

Consequences (For All Years)

Failure to Upload Materials to FAD

Absent exigent circumstances, faculty who do not submit materials for evaluation, will on advice from the chairperson, executive director (if one exists), and dean and at the discretion of the provost, be subject to: 1) being designated as *Does Not Meet Expectations* in each domain of their responsibility; 2) having a professional development plan constructed for them by their department committee, executive director (if one exists), department chairperson, and dean; 3) ineligibility for any compensation adjustments until the next triennial review period; and/or 4) a letter of admonishment from their chairperson (Faculty Handbook Section 350).

Does Not Meet Expectations

Faculty who receive domain-specific performance evaluations of *Does Not Meet Expectations* will have a professional development plan constructed for them with their input by their department committee, executive director (if one exists), department chairperson, and dean within two weeks of the completed review. Failure to agree to submit a professional development plan or failure to show improvement by the end of the designated improvement period may lead to additional consequences.

Faculty who receive domain-specific performance evaluations of *Does Not Meet Expectations* will be ineligible for any salary adjustment and may remain ineligible for any adjustment until achieving at least a *Meets Expectations* designation in a Faculty Performance Evaluation.

Professional Development Plans

The faculty member and their chairperson/executive director will meet to develop the professional development plan. The plan may include (but is not limited to) identifying professional development goals, mentoring, and/or a partial or temporary reassignment of responsibilities. The plan, developed with the input of the faculty member, shall then be recorded in a letter and returned for review to the department committee. The committee may accept the plan or return it to the chairperson/executive director with further recommendations.

Appeal Process

Within 5 days of notification of their evaluation at the department level, a faculty member may forward to the college a one-page objection to any portion, representation, or conclusion of the evaluation. The college committee and the dean shall consider the objection when finalizing the evaluation.

A faculty member may appeal a domain-specific assessment of *Does Not Meet Expectations* to the appropriate college appeals/grievance committee. Appeals may be made on the basis of a) inadequate consideration of the submitted materials; or b) inadequate consideration of the department's recommendation.

Within five (5) working days of notification, the faculty member will provide to the college appeals/grievance committee material that explains the basis for the appeal. The committee will review all material relevant to the performance evaluation. No later than February 1, the committee will report its recommendation affirming or disputing the domain-specific assessment to the faculty member and to the dean. The recommendation by the appeals committee will constitute the final recommendation of the domain-specific assessment of the faculty member's performance. If the committee affirms, the domain-specific assessment will be *Does Not Meet Expectations*. If the committee disputes, the domain-specific assessment will be *Meets Expectations*. The dean will forward the final recommendation of the appeals committee to the provost for a final decision and the appeal ends.

Criteria

In alignment with Indiana State University's and the applicable college's mission, each department will establish the criteria and process by which to evaluate teaching/librarianship, scholarship/creativity, and service. It is strongly advised that each department's criteria be specific to its disciplinary goals and/or program requirements and be reviewed on a regular basis. It is expected that each department's criteria will be more specific than the general guidelines below.

A college may choose to use a single set of guidelines for every department within that college. A department may choose not to create its own criteria in which case the college guidelines shall apply. In both exceptional cases, the college and or department must state that its faculty members are governed by the college criteria in its governing documents.

No criteria may be used to review a faculty member's domain-specific performance unless those criteria have been in place for at least one calendar year prior to the departmental evaluation of materials and were the result of a departmental vote. The inclusion or consideration of any materials or information other than that provided by the faculty member or the department chairperson/executive director is prohibited.

Teaching/Librarianship, Scholarship/Creativity, and Service

Evaluators (committee members, chairpersons, executive directors and/or other immediate supervisors, deans) should focus on the quality of the work in each domain in order to determine whether the faculty member is meeting or not meeting expectations.

Teaching/Librarianship

Meets Expectations: A faculty member meets his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*.

Does Not Meet Expectations: A faculty member fails to meet his/her teaching responsibilities as laid out in section 310.1 of the University Handbook, or regularly engages in one or more of the following practices: teaches courses or practices librarianship in a fashion that produces substantiated breaches of propriety or professionalism including failure to complete required attendance, interim or final grade reporting; refuses to have his/her teaching or librarianship evaluated*; does not substantively cover the prescribed course content; has evaluations* well below those typical of departmental colleagues; generally provides an environment inappropriate to facilitate learning; or in other ways does not meet his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*. University, college, and department wide metrics shall be used, in part, to evaluate a faculty member.

*The Faculty Senate has endorsed a University policy that states that students have the right to evaluate teaching. That policy, however, does not imply that those evaluations should be the sole source of information regarding quality of teaching. The Faculty Senate strongly encourages departments and colleges to use teaching evaluation systems with multiple sources of input that includes student, peer, and chairperson evaluations.

Scholarship/Creativity

Meets Expectations: A faculty member meets his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*.

Does Not Meet Expectations: A faculty member does not have a recent record of scholarship/creativity, and provides no evidence of progress on any project of significant magnitude, or in other ways does not meet his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*.

Service

Meets Expectations: A faculty member meets his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*.

Does Not Meet Expectations: A faculty member does not work with colleagues to advance the mission of the department, college, and/or University, or in other ways does not meet his/her department's definition of *Meets Expectations*.

Irrelevancy of Contributions in Unassigned Domains

Contributions in unassigned domains are not to be considered during this process.

Interpretation

All questions regarding the interpretation of this document shall be directed to the Faculty Senate chairperson. The faculty Senate chairperson shall immediately consult the other Senate officers and the provost on all such questions of interpretation. Their agreed-upon interpretation shall be communicated to the person or body asking for it and shall be considered the final interpretation of these sections. If the Senate officers and the Provost fail to agree on an interpretation, they will present both the question and their respective interpretations to the university President who shall render the final interpretation. The final interpretation will be sent, in writing, to all relevant parties (and at the discretion of the Provost to the deans and chairpersons/executive director) and to the chairperson of the Faculty Affairs Committee of the Faculty Senate for inclusion in the ongoing improvement process described below.

Ongoing Improvement to the Review Process

After each complete three-year review cycle, the Faculty Senate's Faculty Affairs Committee (FAC) will be charged with issuing a report to the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate concerning the effectiveness of the review process in meeting the goals stated in the preamble of this document. In that report, FAC may offer recommendations for improving the review process for the next cycle.

Recommendation: This document is provided to the Board of Trustees for information.

3n Naming of Tabco – Tom and Dotty Bilyeu Lab

This item is to request Board of Trustee approval of the naming of the Tabco – Tom and Dotty Bilyeu Lab located in the lower level room 002 of the Federal Hall Building. The naming of the lab would be the result of a \$25,000 gift from the families of the late Tom and Dotty Bilyeu. The gift has been funded fully with a gift of cash and will support Bridge the Gap Scholarships.

Tom and Dotty Bilyeu started Tabco Business Forms in Terre Haute in 1978. Tom and Dotty remained active as part of Tabco Business Forms, Inc. until their full retirement in 2012. Together the Bilyeu's worked tirelessly to provide educational opportunity for their children and eventually employed their two sons who run the business today. Tom and Dotty were quite proud of the fact that three of their four children and five of their ten grandchildren attended Indiana State University. Tom and Dotty's hard work, dedication, and love in their hearts was synonymous with laying a foundation of success for others. This gift honors the their legacy by providing opportunity for those aspiring to reach their educational goals at Indiana State University, while positively shaping communities in which Sycamore graduates call home.

The amount of the gift for this naming opportunity is consistent with the Indiana State University Naming Policy.

3o Proposed Modification to University's Foundational Statements and removal of statements from University Policy Library

Rationale: In preparation for the development of its next strategic plan, Indiana State University began a review of its foundational statements in August 2019. The review includes the institution's current Mission Statement, Vision Statement and Core Values as shown at: https://www.indstate.edu/policy-library/mission-vision-and-core-values.

President Deborah Curtis asked Dr. Brad Balch, dean emeritus of Indiana State's Bayh College of Education and professor of education, to lead this review process. Dr. Balch has more than 20 years of strategic planning experience and has served as a consultant to numerous educational entities. He has been working with Teresa Exline, chief of staff, in guiding this process.

Last fall, Dr. Balch conducted a series of individual and group sessions to garner input from campus and various ISU leadership groups. An electronic survey was also provided to the entire campus to garner additional input. In total, around 200 individuals participated in this portion of the process.

The results of these sessions were used to help guide a small working group led by Dr. Balch and including Chris MacDonald, chair of the Faculty Senate; Todd LaComba, chair of the Staff Council; Madison Longyear, President of the Student Government Association; Santhana Naidu, Associate Vice President and Chief Marketing Officer; and Teresa Exline.

The group developed new draft core values, vision and mission statements which were presented to the Board at its February 21, 2020 meeting for information. The statements were also distributed to campus for additional feedback. Based upon that feedback and additional conversations with the working group and campus leadership, further revisions were made.

The revised statements are:

Core Values

Indiana State is committed to these core values:

Learning: We prepare the next generation of leaders and citizens by providing personalized and transformative experiences that lead to success in the classroom and beyond.

Discovery: We nurture intellectual curiosity and growth through the creation of new knowledge and the joy of enhanced human understanding.

Engagement: We collaborate with our local and global communities to create long-term relationships, connectedness with integrity, and a shared sense of pride.

Inclusiveness: We take action to honor the diversity of individuals, ideas and expressions, ensuring they are genuinely recognized, valued, and lived.

Indiana State University Vision Statement

We will be the university of choice for students seeking a distinctive, high-quality education highlighted by challenging experiences that prepare our graduates to contribute to the economic vitality and civic and cultural development of their communities and the global society.

Indiana State University Mission Statement

We transform the lives of students through a high-quality education infused with experiential learning, community engagement and career-readiness. Our students succeed within a culture of inclusion and support that provides the skills and knowledge to impact Indiana and beyond.

As part of this process, management is also recommending that the Core Values, Vision, and Mission statements be removed from the policy library (current policy 110) and placed on a dedicated webpage. Appropriate units from throughout the University (Policy Library, Board of Trustees, Office of the President, Strategic Planning, Academic Affairs, Human Resources, Governance Units, etc.) will link to this dedicated site.

Revenues

Student Tuition

Fall semester tuition of \$43.4 million is below budget by \$2.5 million. Spring semester tuition is also below budget by \$1.7 million. This does not include any transfer for Spring revenue sharing programs. The University has budgeted \$4.0 million as a reserve to offset this shortfall. Summer school tuition totals \$4.1 million which reflects only the second half of summer as this

crosses the fiscal years with the remaining tuition income for summer to be recognized before June 30, 2020.

Other Fees and Charges

Other Fees and Charges are above last year's amount by \$194,432. This is due to an additional amount of distance delivery fees of \$256,403 and a reduction of change of course, collection and deferment fees.

Other Income and Transfers

Other Income and Transfers are above last year's totals by \$595,901 which reflects increased utility reimbursement by Residential Life, increased interest income allocated to the general fund and timing of project management fee recognition.

Program Fees

Program Fees increased by \$182,921 due to new NHHS nursing fees.

Reimbursements and Income Reappropriated from Other Sources

Income from these sources are down \$876,065 resulting from reduced marketing transfer and close-out of designated Academic Affairs funds in 2019.

Expenses

Compensation

Compensation expense is below last year's total by \$2.5 million. Salaries and Wages are down \$2.4 million to reflect reduced administrative, instructional, support, overtime, and student wages. Fringe benefits decreased by \$0.1 million due to reduced medical, retirement, and FICA costs that were offset by timing of retirement incentive payouts.

Departmental Expenses

Total Departmental Expenses decreased \$1,038,800. Supplies and Related Expenses decreased by \$1,552,052 due to reduced searches, travel, printing, marketing, and student media purchases. Repairs and Maintenance expenses are up \$518,512 on increased encumbrances in Facilities Management. Other Committed Expenses are down \$5,260 from the previous year.

Utilities and Related Expenses

Utilities and Related Expenses are below last year's total by \$497,754 reflecting lower sewage, natural gas, and water costs.

Equipment and Other Capital

Equipment and Other Capital expenditures are up \$484,689. Library Acquisitions are below last year's expenditures by \$486,795 due to timing of purchase orders on library subscription services. Operating Equipment expenses are down \$673,309 as the result of reduced technology and student media purchases. Capital Improvement costs are up \$1,650,793 due to timing of transfers.

Student Scholarship and Fee Remissions

Student Scholarship and Fee Remissions are above last year's total by \$618,118. The growth in scholarships reflects a change that started in FY18 in eligibility criteria for merit based aid and the addition of the Illinois scholarship and Midwest Achievement scholarship programs. Based on Fall and Spring scholarship data a projected \$3.2 million budget deficit is anticipated. The Laptop scholarship program will produce a \$485,060 reversion and was netted against the scholarship shortfall.

Academic Debt Service

Academic Debt Service is at \$12.2 million for 2020 and shows a decrease of \$74,547. This reflects the debt service schedule for 2020.

Budgeted Reserve

For FY20 a budgeted reserve of \$4.0 million was established to be used to offset tuition revenue shortfalls and student scholarship and fee remission overages.

<u>Transfers Out and Program Fees</u> Transfers Out decreased \$753,532 due to the reduction in course fee transfers and the timing of the RHIC transfer.
