Federal regulations require that the IRB be composed of at least five (5) members (45 CFR 46.107). Representation must include: (a) at least two members whose primary concerns are in scientific areas, such that both social and behavioral sciences and biomedical sciences are represented; (b) at least one member whose primary concerns are in non-scientific areas; and (c) a community representative who is not otherwise affiliated with ISU nor a member of the immediate family of an ISU employee.

One member or alternate must be able to act as an advocate for children, by virtue of experience and education.

One member or alternate must be able to act as an advocate for justice involved persons, by virtue of experience and education.

The membership includes all genders, as well as representation of racial and ethnic minority groups.
