

Assistant or Associate Professor in Clinical Psychology

The Department of Psychology at Indiana State University invites applications for a tenure-track appointment at the rank of assistant or associate professor to begin Fall 2026. The position will primarily support our APA accredited clinical psychology doctoral (Psy.D.) program and include some undergraduate teaching. The position is open to clinical or counseling psychologists who are eligible for licensure and endorsement as a Health Service Provider in Psychology (HSPP) in Indiana. We welcome applications from individuals in all areas of clinical and counseling psychology, but candidates with interest and experience in clinical training/supervision, assessment, health psychology, or child/adolescent psychopathology are especially encouraged to apply. Individuals who may have had non-traditional career paths, who have taken time off for family reasons, or who have achieved excellence in careers outside of academia are also encouraged to apply.

Responsibilities

- Teach courses at the undergraduate and graduate level. The typical teaching load is 3 classes per semester
- Supervision of empirical Psy.D. dissertations
- Provide supervision for graduate students providing therapy and assessment service at our in-house training clinic
- Maintain a program of research that involves students (graduate and/or undergraduate)
- Contribute to service activities in the department and university

Required Qualifications

- Ph.D or PsyD in counseling or clinical psychology. ABD candidates will be considered but the degree should be awarded prior to the time the position begins.
- Licensed or license-eligible and endorsement as Health Service Provider in Psychology (HSPP) in Indiana.
- History or promise of teaching excellence

Preferred Qualifications

- Interest and experience in clinical training/supervision
- Ability to contribute to diversity-focused training in our clinical psychology doctoral program

To apply, candidates must submit a cover letter that includes information on teaching and research interests, vita, graduate transcripts, and a list of references (to be contacted if invited to interview). There are two open positions and review of applications will continue until positions are filled (e.g., into Spring 2026 semester).
