Virtual Series: Explicit Instruction



This virtual series is provided by the Blumberg Center for Interdisciplinary Studies in Special Education at Indiana State University. The Center offers technical assistance to schools and districts by providing resources, professional learning, coaching, and implementation support.

Series Description:

This four-part series aims to clearly define explicit instruction for educators and provide effective strategies for implementing explicit instruction into daily planning and instruction. K-12 educators will benefit from the practical approaches described in this series and will be able to implement explicit instruction in any content area.

Session 1: Explicit Instruction 101: The Blueprint for Strong Teaching

This session introduces the core principles of explicit instruction and why it consistently improves student learning across grade levels and content areas. Participants will explore the research behind EI, walk through the essential components of an explicit lesson, and analyze short video clips to identify what high-quality implementation looks like. By the end, teachers will leave with a clear framework they can immediately apply to any unit or skill.

Session 2: Show, Don't Tell: Crafting Powerful Models and Demonstrations

In this session, teachers dive deep into the art of modeling—one of the most influential components of explicit instruction. Participants will learn how to break down complex tasks, highlight critical steps, and think aloud in ways that make invisible cognitive work visible to students. Through collaborative practice, they will build and refine their own models, ensuring clarity, precision, and engagement.

Session 3: Make Thinking Visible: Questions, Prompts, and Checks for Understanding (CFUs) that Drive Learning This session focuses on the interactive heart of explicit instruction: checking for understanding. Teachers will learn high-leverage questioning strategies, effective retrieval practices, and efficient ways to collect real-time data on student progress. Participants will practice crafting prompts that surface misconceptions early and explore routines that ensure all students are accountable for thinking—not just the most vocal ones.

Session 4: Release with Confidence: Moving Students Toward Independence

The final session guides teachers through the gradual release process, emphasizing how to scaffold practice without overwhelming learners. Participants will examine when and how to shift from guided to independent practice, how to provide targeted feedback during the transition, and how to design tasks that lead to durable mastery. Teachers will leave with tools to ensure students can apply skills confidently and correctly—even without teacher support.
