Notification and Acknowledgement of Limitations to Clinical Placement and Licensure

Successful admission to the baccalaureate nursing program at Indiana State University does not guarantee clinical placement in affiliated clinical agencies. Examples of factors that could prevent placement at clinical sites are provided below. Provided examples are not exhaustive, and clinical agencies reserve the right to deny placement.

This means that if you answer "yes" to any of the following questions, any clinical agency may deny placement. Furthermore, the State Board of Nursing may choose to review the application for licensure on an individual basis to determine eligibility.

1. Has disciplinary action ever been taken regarding any health license, certificate, registration, or permit you hold or have ever held in any state or country?
2. Have you ever been denied a license, certificate, registration, or permit to practice as a nurse or any regulated health occupation in any state or country?
3. Are there charges pending against you regarding a violation of any Federal, State, or local law relating to the use, manufacturing, distribution or dispensing of controlled substances, alcohol, or other drugs?
4. Have you ever been convicted or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to:
 - a. A violation of any Federal, State or local law relating to the use, manufacturing, distribution or dispensing of controlled substances, alcohol, or other drugs?
 - b. To any offense, misdemeanor or felony in any state? (except for minor violations of traffic laws resulting in fines)
5. Have you ever been terminated, reprimanded, disciplined or demoted in the scope of your practice as a nurse or as another health care professional?
6. Have you ever had a malpractice judgment against you or settled any malpractice action?
7. Are you now being or have you ever been treated for drug or alcohol abuse?

Successful completion of the baccalaureate nursing program at Indiana State University does not guarantee that a student will be eligible to take the RN (registered nurse) licensure examination in Indiana or any other state.

Indiana Code Article 23. Nurses Chapter 1. Licensing of Nurses 25-23-1-11. Requirements for registered nurse applicants; endorsement license; fees; use of title:

Sec. 11. (A) Any person who applies to the board for a license to practice as a registered nurse must:

- (1) not have:
 - (A) been convicted of a crime that has a direct bearing on the person's ability to practice competently; or
 - (B) committed an act that would constitute a ground for a disciplinary sanction;
