Kaplan Admission Test (KAT) - Pre-admission Examination Benchmarks

Note: Benchmarks are reviewed at least annually.

1. Registration

Traditional track KAT registrations must meet the following guidelines:

- All students must complete the KAT on campus.
- All registrations must be completed within no less than 1 business day of the scheduled exam, or the student will not be allowed to test.
- A change of registration to a later date outside the given testing window must have prior authorization from the Testing Assistant.
- Any student who fails to attend a scheduled KAT exam must provide acceptable documentation of good and proper reasons for the absence in order to have their test rescheduled.

LPN-BSN and Accelerated Second-Degree track registrations must meet the following guidelines:

- All students must complete the KAT remotely using the online proctoring service Examity and are responsible for associated fees.
- A change of registration to a later date outside the given testing window must have prior authorization from the Testing Assistant.

2. Benchmarks:

- Traditional and Accelerated Second-Degree students should *strive for* an overall score of 70%. Admission is competitive and dependent no applicant pool. Achieving an overall score of 70% does not guarantee admission. The section scores for reading, writing, math, and science will be used in the selection process.
- LPN-BSN students <u>must</u> achieve a minimum overall score of 70%. Admission is competitive and dependent on applicant pool. Achieving an overall score of 70% does not guarantee admission.
- 3. The first proctored examination should be taken early enough to allow time for remediation and retesting as required to meet the deadline for application for admission to the major.
- 4. The KAT may only be taken twice per application cycle.
- 5. The highest score of the last two attempts of the current version of the KAT taken through Indiana State will be used.

- 6. KAT scores may be used for two years provided no additional attempts have been made and the exam has not changed.
- 7. Students become ineligible for consideration for admission during the current application cycle when one or more of the following apply:
 - Any established benchmarks are not met on the second attempt.
 - Testing (first or second attempt) occurs after the deadline for application for admission.
 - The student has taken more than two attempts to achieve any established benchmarks in one admission cycle. A third attempt, regardless of score, will result in ineligibility for the application cycle.
