3 New Business Items

3a Approval of the Minutes of the February 22, 2019 Meeting and Certification of Executive Session

The Indiana State University Board of Trustees met in Executive Session at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, February 22, 2019 in the State Room, Tiley Hall.

The Indiana State University Board of Trustees hereby certifies that no subject matter was discussed in the Executive Session other than the subject matter specified in the public notice.

The Trustees met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Friday, February 22, 2019 at 1:30 p.m.

Recommendation: Approve the Board Minutes for February 22, 2019 and Certification of Executive Session.

3b Finance Committee Report (Mr. Taylor)

3b1 Year-End Closing Authorization

The State Board of Accounts has advised that the Treasurer of Indiana State University obtain approval from the Board of Trustees to make various year-end closing entries. These entries normally consist of transfers, adjustments, and consolidations necessary to ensure the elimination of minor budgetary overdrafts, and the write-off of bad debt. The closing of the financial records is guided by GASB accounting and reporting standards and best business practices.

Recommendation: Authorization of the Treasurer or designee to make all necessary year-end closing entries and distributions.

3c Modification to the University Handbook

3c1 Policy 305 Faculty Appointment, Promotion, and Tenure, Section 18 University Promotion and Tenure Oversight Committee and Section 19 Policies and Procedures for the Evaluation, Renewal, and Promotion of Instructors.

Rationale: The Faculty Senate proposes a modification to Sections 18 and 19 of Policy 305. The proposed language provides clarity on the available bases for appeal by instructors during a period of appointment and recommendations against promotion to senior instructor. The Senate approved the recommended policy change. The administration supports this modification to Policy 305.

Proposed Language.

305.18 University Promotions and Tenure Oversight Committee

305.18.1 Functions. The University Promotions and Tenure Oversight Committee reviews the established criteria and performance standards and processes of the departments, the schools, the college, and the library at least every five years. A report of each review will be provided to the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate, the Provost, the respective Dean, College, department/school and chair. The purpose of such reviews is to promote continuous improvement in the review process and to advise on the relative effectiveness of the unit's guidelines and practices in supporting faculty achievements.

The functions of the University Promotions and Tenure Oversight Committee include but are not limited to the following:

- a) Maintain guidelines for the documentation of achievements for promotion and tenure.
- b) Promote continuous improvement in the review and appeal processes.
- c) Promote consistency in the promotion and tenure review processes across academic units and assure criteria and performance standards are consistent with University policies and procedures relative to the awarding of academic rank and tenure, while also insuring flexibility necessary to meet differing disciplinary and unit missions.

d) Serve as a resource for faculty and administrators who make tenure and promotion recommendations and for faculty at large.

e) ~~Hear appeals of recommendations for non-renewal during the probationary period and negative promotion and tenure decisions based on inadequate consideration or violations of academic freedom.~~ Hear appeals of recommendations for (i) non-renewal of Tenure-Track Faculty during the probationary period, (ii) non-continuation of Instructors or Senior Instructors during an appointment period, (iii) negative promotion and tenure, or promotion to Senior Instructor decisions based on inadequate consideration or violations of academic freedom, and (iv) ineligibility of reappointment at the end of an appointment period. Recommendations of non-reappointment received at the end of an Instructor's or Senior Instructor's appointment period – whether eligible for reappointment or not – are not subject to appeal.

305.19.1.3 Possible Outcome of Annual Review. ~~Annual reviews through the sixth year result in a recommendation for continuation, conditional continuation (years one and two, four and five), reappointment (third year), or termination of appointment during the appointment period and reappointment or non-reappointment in final year of the appointment period. Appointments of Instructors who do not demonstrate satisfactory performance shall be terminated. Termination of appointment or non-reappointment is also contingent upon the mission and need of the department as well as available resources at the time the review decision is made. Instructors who receive recommendations of non-reappointment (in the third or subsequent year of an appointment) may be offered an appointment as a part-time temporary faculty for the subsequent term when continuing need is demonstrated and resources remain available.~~ During an appointment period (e.g., years 1 and 2 of a 3-year appointment), annual reviews result in a recommendation for continuation, conditional continuation, or termination for failure to demonstrate satisfactory performance. In the last year of an appointment period, annual reviews result in a determination of eligibility or ineligibility for reappointment that is separate from a decision to renew the appointment. Eligibility or ineligibility for reappointment will be based on evaluations of satisfactory versus unsatisfactory performance. Recommendations for renewal of an appointment may be based on performance criteria as well as the mission and needs of the department and/or availability of resources to support the reappointment.

305.19.1.3.1 Special Case of Non-reappointment. Instructors who are determined eligible for reappointment but whose appointments are not renewed may apply for lecturer or instructor positions for subsequent terms. An instructor who is ineligible for reappointment or whose appointment has been terminated shall be precluded from upcoming appointments in the reviewing department for a period of no less than one year.

305.19.1.4 Promotion and Renewal are Separate Decisions. The renewal of an instructor and the promotion of an instructor are separate decisions.

305.19.4 Appeal. Recommendations of termination during a period of appointment, of ineligibility for reappointment at the end of an appointment period, or denial of promotion to Senior Instructor may be appealed to the University Promotions and Tenure Oversight Committee. Recommendations of non-

reappointment received at the end of an Instructor's or Senior Instructor's appointment period – whether eligible for future reappointment or not – are not subject to appeal. Appeals may be made only on the basis of

- a) inadequate consideration of the submitted materials bearing on the relevant performance of the candidate;
- b) inadequate consideration given to the department's recommendation; or
- c) violation of academic freedom.

305.19.4.1 Appeal Process. The Appeal process follows that outlined for Tenured and Tenure-track faculty.

Recommendation: Approve modifications to Policy 305, Sections 18 and 19.

3c2 Proposed Modification to Policy 305 Faculty Appointment, Promotion, and Tenure, Section 20 Policies and Procedures for the Evaluation and Reappointment of Lecturers.

Rationale: The Faculty Senate proposes a modification to Section 20 of Policy 305 Policies and Procedures for the Evaluation and Reappointment of Lecturers. The Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate charged the Senate Faculty Affairs Committee to streamline the review process. The Senate approved the recommended policy change, which focuses the evaluation of lecturers at the department level and provides that deans will make determinations in the case of inconsistent reviews. The administration supports the modification to the Policy.

Proposed Language.

305.20 Policies and Procedures for the Evaluation and Reappointment of Lecturers

305.20.1 Policies for the Evaluation and Reappointment of Lecturers.

305.20.1.1 Evaluation. Lecturers shall be evaluated once annually **based on the department's established criteria and standards of performance and/or any specific terms or conditions of appointment. Evaluations shall ordinarily be limited to activities since the most recent review, but data from prior periods may also be considered (e.g., if current syllabi or teaching evaluations are unavailable, to determine whether behavior is indicative of a pattern or aberration, or to assess responsiveness to previous review comments).** ~~The evaluation shall be based on the department's established criteria and standards of performance.~~

305.20.1.2 Criteria and Responsibility for Evaluation. Each department and the college/library shall maintain established criteria and standards for satisfactory performance by Lecturers and ensure the

criteria are accessible to Lecturers. The candidate's departmental colleagues shall have primary authority and responsibility for assessing academic discipline-specific performance.

305.20.1.3 Peer Review Committees. Each department shall elect a peer review committee of faculty members, including at least one tenured faculty member, and one Instructor, where appropriate, to evaluate the performance of Lecturers. Chairpersons and deans shall not serve on these committees. It is the Lecturer's responsibility to present to reviewing bodies evidence of satisfactory performance in the specified areas of responsibility.

305.20.1.4 Possible Outcomes upon Review. Lecturers whose performance is judged to be satisfactory are determined eligible for reappointment and may be recommended for continued teaching as need exists and resources are available. ~~and where the need exists and the resources are available may be recommended for reappointment.~~

305.20.2 Procedures for Annual Review of Lecturers.

305.20.2.1 Timing of Review by the Department. ~~Lecturers submit to their departments portfolios documenting their achievements in their areas of responsibility. Departments shall review all Lecturers within four weeks prior to the end of the last academic term of their appointment. These portfolios are reviewed independently by the department peer review committee and chairperson. Each makes a separate recommendation, applying the department established criteria and performance standards, and taking into account the terms and conditions of the appointment and comments generated during previous annual reviews. Lecturers are notified of these recommendations and their rationales in accordance with the review calendar published annually by departments.~~

305.20.2.2 Basis of Reviews. Reviews shall consider available departmental and institutional data, including copies of syllabi, teaching evaluations, patterns of attendance and grade reporting, etc. (for teaching appointments) and other relevant data (for non-teaching appointments). Lecturers shall also be invited to submit a portfolio documenting achievements in their areas of responsibility.

305.20.2.3 Process of Departmental Review.

305.20.2.3.1 Recommendations. The review committee and Department Chair shall reach independent judgments as to whether the lecturer is "eligible for reappointment" and should remain in the pool of possible lecturers for additional assignments (as needs and resources allow) or "ineligible for reappointment". When required to satisfy accreditation or equivalent professional standards, an additional level of review, prior to the college level review, may be conducted and the form amended to include the additional review.

305.20.3.1.1 Consistent Recommendation. If the two recommendations are consistent, they shall be forwarded to the Dean. In the event there is another level of review prior to College level, if all recommendations are consistent, they shall be forwarded to the Dean.

305.20.2.3.1.2 Inconsistent Recommendation. If the recommendations are inconsistent, the Department Chair and Review Committee will meet in an attempt to come to an agreement. If this does not yield a consistent recommendation, the matter

shall be forwarded to the college dean for resolution. In the event there is another level of review prior to College level, if the recommendations are inconsistent they will meet in an attempt to come to an agreement. If this does not yield a consistent recommendation, the matter shall be forwarded to the college dean for resolution.

305.20.2.4 College Level Process. The College Dean shall be responsible for (a) oversight of the timing and process of reviews, (b) notification of recommendations, and (c) review of inconsistent recommendations.

305.20.2.4.1 Consistent Recommendations. If the Department's recommendations are consistent, the Lecturer shall be notified of their eligibility/ineligibility for future appointment and provided a copy of the comments from the Departmental reviews. Copies shall also be forwarded to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs for inclusion in the Lecturer's official personnel file.

305.20.2.4.2 Inconsistent Recommendations. If the Department's recommendations are inconsistent, the Dean or an appropriate designee shall review the divergent recommendations made by the Department Committee and Chairperson, the supporting documentation/evidence for their statements, and the established Departmental standards. The Dean or designee shall make the final determination of eligibility/ineligibility for reappointment. Notification of the final recommendation shall include both the Department's and the Dean's / Designee's comments and be sent to the lecturer and to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs for inclusion in the Lecturer's official personnel file.

305.20.2.4.3 Timing of Notification. Notifications of Lecturers under this policy shall be completed no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the last academic term of their appointment.

~~**305.20.2.1.1 Special Circumstance Requiring Additional Level Review.** When required to satisfy accreditation or equivalent professional standards, an additional level of review, prior to the college level review, may be conducted and the form amended to include the additional review.~~

~~**305.20.2.1.2 Positive Recommendations.** If department level recommendations are positive, the lecturer's materials and recommendations are forwarded to the appropriate dean for consideration.~~

~~**305.20.2.1.3 Cases of Negative Recommendations.** If one or more of the department level recommendations is negative, Lecturers may choose to a) terminate the process; or b) prepare a response within the next five (5) days, which is included in the faculty evaluation file and forwarded to the next level of review. In choosing to terminate the process a Lecturer withdraws from consideration for further faculty appointment for a period of at least once year in the reviewing department.~~

~~**305.20.2.42 Review by the College. College Level Process.** Lecturers' portfolios are evaluated independently by the appropriate dean, whose independent recommendation is based on the college's established criteria and performance standards for Lecturers. The dean shall not substitute his/her~~

own assessment of academic discipline-specific faculty achievements for that of the department. Candidates are notified of the dean's recommendations and rationales in accordance with the review calendar published by the College/Library.

305.20.2.2.1 Positive Recommendations. If the Dean's recommendation is positive it is forwarded with the candidate's materials to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

305.20.2.2.2 Cases of Inconsistent Recommendations. If the Department and Dean's recommendations are inconsistent, candidates may elect to a) terminate the review process, or b) prepare a written response within the next five (5) days, which is forwarded with their materials to the next level of review. A copy of the written response is also forwarded to the candidate's department peer review committee and chairperson. In choosing to terminate the process, the lecturer also withdraws from consideration for further faculty appointment for a period of at least one year in the reviewing department at Indiana State University.

305.20.2.2.3 Cases of Negative Recommendations. If the Dean and Department recommendations are negative, the process concludes.

305.20.2.3 Review by the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs. The Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs reviews recommendations from the department and the Deans as well as the candidate's responses and makes a recommendation for reappointment or non-reappointment.

305.20.2.4 Notice of Recommendation. The Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs notifies Lecturers of his/her recommendation (a) by December 1 (part time temporary faculty with fall only appointments) or (b) by March 1 (full time temporary faculty and part time temporary faculty with fall and spring appointments) or (c) by May 1 (for spring only appointments). The candidate's dean, department chairperson, and department peer review committee are also informed of this recommendation. Results of annual evaluations will be taken into consideration in any decision to re-appoint Lecturer. Reappointment may also be contingent upon the mission and need of the department, college, or university at the time the review decision.

Recommendation: Approve modifications to Policy 305.20

3c3 Proposed Modification to Policy 350 Academic Department Chairperson, Section 2 Academic Department Chairperson Duties and Responsibilities

Rationale: The Faculty Senate proposes a modification to Section 2 of Policy 350 Academic Department Chairperson Duties and Responsibilities. The Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate charged the Senate Faculty Affairs Committee to review the policy on written admonishments of faculty members for deficient performance. The proposed policy modifications clarify the timing of the notification to the faculty member, dean, and personnel committee. The Faculty Senate approved the policy modification. The administration supports the modification to the Policy.

Proposed Language.

(Proposed additions appear in red and deletions in strikethrough)

350.2.9.1.3 Deficient Performance. If a department chairperson becomes concerned that a faculty member may be performing his or her duties and responsibilities of employment deficiently, the chairperson shall investigate the matter. If the investigation confirms the chairperson's concern, he/she should attempt an informal resolution. If the matter is not resolved informally, the chairperson should notify the faculty member **within five working days** of his/her intent to pursue a formal resolution.

350.2.9.1.3.1 Time for Response. After the faculty member has received notification of the chair's intention, he/she shall be given five (5) working days to provide evidence to counter the chairperson's concern or to propose a satisfactory remedy to the situation with a stipulated timeline.

350.2.9.1.3.2 Right of Consultation. The faculty member and/or the chairperson may seek consultation of members of the department personnel committee regarding judgments of deficient performance and satisfactory remedies.

350.2.9.1.3.3 Written Admonishment. If the faculty member fails to provide sufficient evidence to counter the chair's concern or to remedy his/her deficient performance as was proposed, the chairperson shall provide the faculty member with a written admonishment that sets forth the deficiency of performance, actions the faculty member can take to remedy the deficiency, and a date by which the deficiency must be remedied. **The Personnel Committee shall ordinarily be notified that a written admonishment has been given to the faculty member and a copy of the written admonishment shall may be provided to the department personnel committee and dean-; however, the faculty member may request that notification not be given to the Personnel Committee – a request that the chairperson may grant based on his/her judgment that the behavior is unlikely to be on-going/repetitive.**

350.2.9.1.3.3.1 Required Faculty Reporting. Repeated deficient performance related to required faculty reporting (i.e., 3-week attendance, interim grading, final grades) shall result in written admonishment.

350.2.9.1.3.4 Chair's Evaluation of Subsequent Performance. If the chairperson determines a sufficient remedy has been accomplished, a letter stating that will be **submitted to the faculty member and the dean as well as** included in the **official** personnel file-; **and if they had been notified of the letter of admonishment, the Personnel Committee shall also be notified that a remedy has been accomplished.** If the deficient performance continues following a written admonishment, the chairperson shall notify the faculty member, the personnel committee, and the dean of the continued deficient performance formally enlisting the dean's assistance.

350.2.9.1.3.5 Dean's Prerogative. Upon the receipt of a notice of continued deficient performance, the dean may require a remediation plan, render the faculty member ineligible for any and all course releases or travel funds to which they may otherwise be entitled, or recommend additional actions be taken by the Provost. Those additional actions could include (but are not limited to) a reassignment of workload, the denial of all compensation adjustments for a defined period, and/or the initiation of the discipline/dismissal process following procedures outlined elsewhere in the University Policy Library.

350.2.9.1.3.6 Right of Rebuttal. A faculty member who receives a written admonishment, a notification of continued deficient performance, or other penalty imposed by the dean shall have five (5) working days to provide a written rebuttal with copies to the chairperson, the departmental personnel committee and the dean. The departmental personnel committee may also submit one or more letters, in support of the chairperson's or dean's decision, or the faculty member's response.

350.2.9.1.3.7 Personnel Files. All documents associated with this policy (written admonishments, **acknowledgment of remedy**, notices of continued deficient performance, decision by the dean, and letters of rebuttal or support) shall be placed in the faculty member's official personnel file (as outlined elsewhere in the University Policy Library) and may be ~~provided~~ **available** to the personnel committee at the time of the next **annual or biennial** review.

350.2.9.1.3.8 Due Process. Faculty members may use established, college-level grievance procedures to review the accuracy and relevance of concerns and/or the actions taken and request a corrective response.

Recommendation: Approve modifications to Policy 350.2

3c4 Proposed Modification to Policy 310 Faculty Duties and Responsibilities, Section 1.12 Textbooks

Rationale:

The Faculty Senate proposes a modification to Section 1.12 of Policy 310 Faculty Duties and Responsibilities to simplify the textbook adoption process by allowing department chairpersons management and oversight of the selection process and to give faculty additional flexibility. The Faculty Senate approved the policy modification. The administration supports the modification to the Policy.

Proposed Language.

(Proposed additions appear in red and deletions in strikethrough.)

310.1.12 Textbooks. Textbooks and other materials are selected by the faculty primarily to promote student learning. Because there are affordability and course outcome issues that must be considered, the selection of textbooks and other materials must be selected in accordance with the foregoing policies as well as departmentally-approved policies. The departmental chairperson is responsible for selection facilitation and implementation in accordance with the provisions of this section. The goals of these textbook policies are to comply with applicable laws, facilitate student procurement of textbooks, address textbook affordability, and ensure instructional quality.

310.1.12.1 Definition, Selection, Ordering, and Conflict of Interest.

- a. The course schedule for a term will be published by October 1 and March 1; Textbook and non-sharable required materials selection deadlines will be October 15 and March 15 (for Spring; and Summer and Fall terms respectively).
- b. It is the responsibility of administrators and department chairpersons to make resource allocations and course assignments so as to facilitate timely adoptions.
- c. All textbook and materials orders will be placed through the academic department. The chairperson will review for compliance with these policies and supervise the placing of orders.
- d. For the purposes of this policy the term “textbook” shall be defined as the central text associated with significant expense and shall not include readings or other ancillary and inexpensive texts.
- e. ~~Department committees will designate default texts for all courses taught at least annually following established departmental procedures. Default texts will be ordered by chairpersons in cases of late decisions, resignations, illnesses, and late faculty appointments and/or assignments. Chairpersons shall select a text for sections with no assigned instructors when no default has been identified. Ordinarily default texts should be chosen by faculty most responsible for teaching a course although faculty teaching subsequent courses in a program also hold interest in the teaching of lower level classes. It is expected that the default textbook will be among those used for another section of the course if any.~~ Department chairpersons shall consult with appropriate faculty (ordinarily those most responsible for teaching a course or subsequent courses in a sequence) to select a “default” text. Default texts will be ordered by chairpersons in cases of late decisions, resignations, illnesses, and late faculty appointments and/or assignments. Chairpersons shall select a text for sections with no assigned instructors when no default has been identified. It is expected that the default textbook will be among those used for another section of the course if any. Faculty shall be precluded from changing textbooks orders for that term.
- f. ~~Chairpersons shall similarly order default texts for faculty who fail to submit orders by established deadlines.~~ Except in cases where a department has an approved policy regarding a common textbook for a multi-section course, individual faculty who are deemed by the Chairperson likely to teach a section of a multi-section course for every term of the selection period may choose alternative textbook(s) and materials as long as they do not exceed the cost of the default selection(s) and the order is made by the deadline.
- g. ~~Faculty shall be precluded from changing textbooks orders made under (5) — (6) for that term.~~ To minimize possible conflict of economic interest in textbook selection, recommendations for selection of basic or supplementary textbooks authored by ISU faculty must include the approval of the department chairperson or the responsible dean, if appropriate. A statement must accompany such recommendation indicating (a) that no other textbooks containing material appropriate to the course are available, or (b) that if other textbooks are available, the textbook selected is deemed most appropriate.
- h. ~~Except in cases where a department has an approved policy regarding a common textbook for a multi-section course, individual faculty who are deemed by the Chairperson likely to teach a section of a multi-section course for every term of the selection period may choose alternative textbook(s) and~~

materials as long as they do not exceed the cost of the default selection(s) and the order is made by the deadline.

i. To minimize possible conflict of economic interest in textbook selection, recommendations for selection of basic or supplementary textbooks authored by ISU faculty must include the approval of the department chairperson or the responsible dean, if appropriate. A statement must accompany such recommendation indicating (a) that no other textbooks containing material appropriate to the course are available, or (b) that if other textbooks are available, the textbook selected is deemed most appropriate.

310.1.12.2 Adoption periods. The standard selection period for a textbook is based upon the type of course offering as established below:

a. A minimum of three years (or the publication life of the edition of the text whichever is shorter) for courses offered annually in which the text has resale value.

b. No minimum selection period will exist for texts for

1. contemporary issues or special topics courses taught under a common course prefix and number.

2. E-books or other text forms where there is no resale value and/or where there will be no opportunities for used texts because of the textbook form.

c. Exceptions to the selection periods will be granted by the chairperson when significant changes have occurred in the discipline; when the previously chosen text fails to promote student learning; when there are significant pedagogical reasons (e.g. distance vs. face to face and regular term vs. summer) which justify shifting texts, or when new texts become available at a lower net cost to students. Chairpersons will document and report these exceptions to the academic dean. Other exceptions may be granted at the agreement of the chairperson and dean. The provost shall be informed of all exceptions.

310.1.12.32 Other (non-sharable) Required Materials.

1. Non-sharable required materials include products or services that
 - a. students must purchase as a required element in the course,
 - b. cannot be shared by students nor, once used, transferred to another student,
 - c. cannot be accessed through a shared university system or license, or
 - d. cannot be purchased except through the bookstore or other specified provider.
2. Costs of required purchases of non-sharable materials must be justified and reported to the chairperson and approved by the Provost. Once approved, such materials may continue to be used in subsequent semesters as long as the cost remains at or below 125% of the initially-approved amount.
3. The process and timeline for selection of non-sharable resources shall follow that of textbooks.

310.1.12.3 Appeals. Appeals by faculty under this policy will be adjudicated by the Student Affairs Committee of the faculty member's college or the appropriate committee designated by the governing body of the college to handle student issues.

~~310.1.12.4 Advisory Committee The Indiana State University Textbook Advisory Committee shall assist the faculty in meeting the above goals by dealing with special issues that may arise, providing education to the faculty on selection alternatives and textbook affordability initiatives, providing education to students on textbook purchase, rental, e-books, etc., and assessing the effectiveness of textbook selection policies in keeping textbooks more affordable.~~

~~a. The Textbook Advisory Committee is composed of one regular faculty member from each College, a library representative, a business/finance representative, a bookstore representative, a records/registrar representative, and an SGA representative. The Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs shall chair the committee. The members of the committee are elected to staggered three-year terms by the faculty of their respective colleges or appointed by the appropriate vice president.~~

~~b. The committee will meet at least twice annually to assess the effectiveness of the University's textbook selection policies and to recommend any modifications that will result in improvements. The committee will submit an annual report of their findings to the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs and the Faculty Senate Executive Committee.~~

Recommendation: Approve modifications to Policy 310.1.12.

3c5 Proposed Modification to Policy 310 Faculty Duties and Responsibilities to add Section 7 Mid-Semester Change of Faculty

Rationale: The Faculty Senate proposes the addition of Section 7 of Policy 310 Faculty Duties and Responsibilities. The additional language will provide guidance to university administrators and faculty when a faculty member becomes unavailable mid-term and must be replaced by another faculty member. The Senate approved the recommended policy change. The administration supports the modification to the Policy.

Proposed Language.

310.1.7 Mid-Semester Change-of-Faculty. Occasionally, due to death, illness, or other unforeseen events, faculty may find themselves taking over instructional responsibility for a course after a class has already begun. In such instances, it is important that faculty respect the prior faculty member's syllabus as much as possible. While new faculty may add additional readings, they should not change the overall topic(s) covered in the class nor add additional costs for the students (i.e., requesting a change in textbook). New faculty may change the modes of assessment (e.g., essay vs multiple-choice exams) but must garner the approval of the department chair to make changes to the: 1. way(s) grades will be computed (e.g., the number and weighting of assignments and the grading scale), except as it might benefit the students' final grades (e.g., addition of

extra-credit opportunities); and, 2. changes to rubrics for major assignments (e.g., term papers). Chairs will consider the academic integrity of the course when making this decision.

Recommendation: Approve modification to Policy 310.1.7

3c6 Proposed Modification to Policy 210 Admissions, Section 5.3 Test Scores

Rationale: The administration proposes that ISU make the SAT optional for admission to the university, except for those students who have a high school grade point average of below a 2.5. Currently, ISU requires that freshman applicants under 21 years of age and transfers who have completed fewer than 24 transferable semester credits submit scores for the SAT or the ACT. The SAT or ACT will still be required for certain merit-based scholarships and for advanced placement. Applicants with a high school grade point average below 2.5 will also be required to submit SAT/ACT scores, along with any other requirements for conditional admission. The proposed change would be implemented for the 2021-2022 academic year. ISU data indicates that high school grade point average is the best predictor of success, which is consistent with national data. Test-optional admissions criteria are increasingly becoming the norm for both colleges and universities of similar size and mission and flagship institutions. This change will allow us to remain competitive and to remove barriers to admission to allow for faster admissions decisions and increased focus on interacting with admitted students. Faculty Senate has approved this policy modification.

Proposed Language

(Proposed additions appear in red and deletions in strikethrough.)

210.1 General Policy. Indiana State University, in affirming its commitment to excellence, recognizes the value of a student population reflecting academic achievement, cultural diversity, and special talents. The University's admissions policies allow for the individual consideration of each applicant and help service a student population with these characteristics.

The primary criterion for admission is evidence that a candidate is prepared to succeed in a degree program. Admission standards are stated in terms of traditional school and college grading systems. For applicants whose records include either a high proportion of nontraditional grades, or a subject pattern which departs markedly from that normally associated with university study, additional evidence of academic potential in support of their applications, such as entrance examinations, interviews, and letters of recommendation, may be requested.

Individuals may seek exceptions to any of the requirements below by petitioning the Admissions Committee to consider additional factors that may indicate college potential. A limited number of students may be admitted on condition that they agree to follow a prescribed course of study and advisement.

210.2 Application Procedures. To be considered for admission, candidates must submit a completed admission application, \$25 non-refundable application processing fee, and have official transcripts sent directly from all secondary and post-secondary institutions (see the Required Transcripts section) to the Office

of Admissions. Applications must be submitted electronically. Visit the University's Web site and follow the links to the Office of Admissions page.

210.3 Admission to Academic Programs. Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to a given academic program or enrollment in specific courses. Applicants are asked to designate their intended major area of study on the application. The academic divisions of the University which may have additional admission requirements will notify applicants of these standards. See appropriate Catalog sections under academic departments and the professional colleges for further details regarding program admission criteria.

210.4 Application Priority Dates. Applications for freshman admission may be filed after the student has completed the junior year in high school. Transfer applicants may apply as early as one academic term in advance of their intended semester of enrollment. Application closing dates for international students may vary. Please refer to Admissions International Application Web page for updated information.

Fall Semester	June 1
Spring Semester	December 1
Summer Session	May 1

Early application is encouraged for scholarship consideration.

210.5 Admission Requirements—All Students.

210.5.1 Required Transcripts. Students must submit official transcripts from all institutions at which college course work has been attempted. Applicants for admission or readmission are required to disclose registration at any college or university and to submit official transcripts documenting that registration as a condition for admission or readmission. Failure to disclose attempted course work at other colleges or universities constitutes fraud upon the University.

210.5.2 Transfer Students. Transfer students who have earned 24 or more transferable semester credits need not ordinarily submit a high school transcript. However, transfer students who have not completed non-native language study at their transfer institution, but did complete a minimum of four courses in high school in a single or multiple non-native language, including American Sign Language (with a grade of C or better), should have their high school transcript sent to the Office of Admissions where the completion of the non-native language requirement will be recorded. To be official, all transcripts must be sent directly from the registrar's office of the schools previously attended to the Office of Admissions at Indiana State University. Electronic transcripts can be issued from Indiana secondary schools utilizing the Commission of Higher Education sponsored Parchment Program. All such documents must be received by the above closing dates to ensure consideration.

210.5.3 Test Scores. ~~Freshman applicants under 21 years of age and transfers who have completed fewer than 24 transferable semester credits, must submit scores for the SAT or the ACT. Test scores are used to obtain a measure of the individual's aptitude, to assist in academic advising, and to assure proper course placement.~~ **SAT and ACT test scores are optional for applicants except those with a high school grade point average of less than 2.5. The SAT or ACT will still be required for certain merit-based scholarships and for advanced placement. Applicants with a high school grade point average of less**

than 2.5 will be required to submit SAT/ACT scores and meet any other requirements for conditional admission.

210.6 Admission Requirements—Freshman.

210.6.1 High School Curriculum. Indiana State University currently recommends the following high school course curriculum. Students who graduate from high school in 1998 or after are expected to complete the Indiana Core 40 curriculum (or equivalent for non-Indiana high school graduates) to qualify for unconditional admission.

210.6.2 Academic Achievement. Freshmen candidates applying directly from high school are expected to complete a rigorous college preparatory curriculum (Core 40 curriculum for Indiana residents) and maintain a competitive grade point of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. (A limited number of students who do not meet these requirements may be admitted conditionally.)

Additional consideration will be given to standardized test scores, the rigor of the high school curriculum, grades earned in academic subjects, and other evidence of academic potential.

Students completing high school equivalency diplomas (such as the GED) are given admission consideration based upon test results and standardized test scores (SAT or ACT).

210.6.3 New Student Orientation. Newly admitted Freshmen and transfer students are required to attend New Student Orientation prior to the start of the semester/term. Students are not allowed to register for coursework outside New Student Orientation unless approved by the Director.

210.6.4 Mathematics Placement Test. In order to correctly place new students in mathematics courses at ISU, all new students are required to take a mathematics placement examination. The test can be taken on-line in less than an hour and must be completed before attending New Student Orientation prior to course registration. There is no charge to take the mathematics placement test. For specific information regarding the on-line mathematics test, refer to the University Testing site.

210.6 Admission Requirements—Transfer Students.

The following are general admission standards for transfer students:

1. Be in good standing at last accredited institution attended.
2. Have a high school record that meets the entrance requirements of freshmen admitted to Indiana State University.
3. Have earned 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) in all college level studies.

Admission to the following require higher standards:

- Bayh College of Education: 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
- Nursing: Once admitted to the University, nursing programs require a separate application.

NOTE: Transferable hours are restricted to courses in which the applicant earned a grade of C or higher, and courses at the 100-level (and above) from regionally accredited colleges and universities. Credit from nationally accredited and/or non-accredited colleges and universities will not transfer.

NOTE: Some programs require higher standards for admission. Students should consult the section of this Catalog that describes the academic program they wish to enter.

210.7 Transfer of Credit Evaluation. Academic deans determine the applicability of transfer credits to requirements within their colleges. Transfer credit will be re-evaluated if a transfer student changes their degree program.

210.7.1 Transferability.

1. The following guidelines govern transfer of courses:
2. Only transfer credits earned in college-level courses (typically numbered 100 or higher) from a regionally accredited college or university will be assigned credit. Credit from nationally accredited and/or non-accredited colleges and universities will not transfer.
3. Only transfer courses in which a grade of C or higher was earned will be assigned credit; courses with a grade of C- or below will not be assigned credit.
4. A maximum of 90 transfer credits may be assigned toward a bachelor's degree.
5. Transfer credits are assigned only for college-level courses.
6. The dean of the college may determine which of the courses taken by the student more than seven years prior to graduation may be applicable to a baccalaureate degree.

210.7.2 Applicability. Application of transfer credits depends on the student's choice of degree program. Transfer credit will be re-evaluated if transfer students change their degree program. Transfer credit may be assigned as course equivalency or as elective credit as described below:

1. *Course equivalency* means that a transfer course is equivalent to a specific Indiana State University course in the major, minor, or Foundational Studies Program by the appropriate department/academic unit. Some course equivalencies have been established through existing agreements between Indiana State University and other colleges and universities; other equivalencies will be determined on an individual basis.
2. *Elective credit* is assigned for courses that meet transfer requirements, but for which no equivalency is determined. Elective credit is usually applied toward total earned credits and may also apply to the major, minor, or Foundational Studies Program. The decision to apply transfer elective credit in a program is made by the appropriate academic unit.

Students who have been offered admission and have submitted official transcripts from regionally accredited colleges or universities to the Indiana State University Office of Admissions should review their degree audit report after admission to Indiana State to identify the status of each course and the total number of credits transferred to Indiana State University. After reviewing the degree audit report, students may request a reconsideration of their transfer credit evaluation from the academic dean's office in the college of the student's intended major. Students access the degree audit report through the MyISU Portal.

210.8 Articulated Programs and General Education Core.

Indiana State University has established articulation agreements with several colleges and universities that allow students to complete a specific associate degree program at another institution and receive up to 90 credits toward a specific bachelor degree program at Indiana State University. Each articulation agreement will stipulate the Indiana State University courses needed to complete the bachelor degree program and any requirements or guidelines that govern a particular agreement (for example, course and cumulative grade point requirements that differ from the University's general requirements). Students should review the articulation requirements presented by the appropriate Indiana State University College or by their chosen program at the institution from which they intend to transfer.

The Office of Registration and Records maintains current listings of articulated programs and course equivalencies between Indiana State University and other colleges and universities. Interested students should consult the Transfer site.

Students who successfully complete the Statewide Transfer General Education Core (STGEC) at an Indiana public institution of higher education, can transfer that coursework as a block of 30 credit hours towards completion of Foundation Studies requirements at Indiana State University.

210.9 Online Undergraduate Programs.

Indiana State offers online programs to students who have an articulated associate of science (A.S.) degree, or associate of applied science (A.A.S.) degree, or who have transferable credits from regionally accredited colleges or universities. For more information, visit Indiana State On-line or call 812-237-2345.

210.10 Undergraduate Admission Requirements—International Students.

Because of the variety of educational systems throughout the world, there are broad admission requirements for international students. An evaluation is made of all credentials associated with the academic qualifications and intended field of study of the applicants. Indiana State University accepts credential evaluation reports from select members of the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services.

International applicants are expected to demonstrate evidence of academic potential. In addition to evidence of academic potential, international students must demonstrate financial responsibility and English language proficiency. Please refer to the Admissions site for English Proficiency requirements and exceptions.

International students should apply early to be assured of timely completion of the admission process. They should contact the United States Consulate concerning the time required to process the education visa, and wait for official notice of admission before traveling to the United States for attendance at Indiana State University. Once admission has been granted and an I-20 visa issued, it is the responsibility of the applicant to make all the necessary arrangements for entrance into the United States and for residence in the State of Indiana throughout the duration of study at the University.

210.10.1 Requirement for International Admissions—Freshmen

Applicants normally receive a response within four to six weeks of receipt of all application materials, including:

1. Completed application
2. Application fee: \$65 (U.S.) non-refundable

3. Official transcripts or a credential evaluation. The credential evaluation process can take several weeks to complete, and we strongly urge you to begin the process as early as possible.
4. Affidavit of financial support
5. Original current bank statement
6. Required English Language Scores. Official Interlink, TOEFL (code 1322), IELTS, or ELS scores (unless exempt) must be sent directly from the testing center to Indiana State University.
7. Copy of passport. If studying in the United States an I-94 card, F-1 or J-1 visa, and I-20 or DS2019 are also required. If currently in the United States but not studying, a copy of the applicable visa must also be submitted.

210.10.2 Requirement for Admissions–Transfers. Applicants normally receive a response within four to six weeks of receipt of all application materials, including:

210.10.3 Financial Support.

1. Applicants need to show financial support to cover educational expenses before admission is granted and the I-20 is issued.
2. I-20 verification is issued by the Center for Global Engagement.
3. All applicants should supply an affidavit of financial support and original bank statement with current information.
4. Government sponsored applicants must provide an official or certified copy of the award, specifying validity for Indiana State University, listing the expenses and fees covered by the award, beginning and ending dates of study covered, the level/field of study, and the length of the award. The address for billing must also be included.
5. Those applicants who are academically eligible yet fail to prove adequate financial documentation will receive a letter explaining that admission is delayed until the University can be assured of the student's financial support. Some applicants may be requested to deposit funds in an account with the Indiana State University Office of the Controller prior to admission.

210.10.4 Transfer of Credit for International Students. Academic deans determine the applicability of transfer credits to requirements within their colleges. Transfer credit will be re-evaluated if transfer students change their degree program. Transfer credits are restricted to college-level courses from institutions accredited by the ministry of higher education in the home country and must meet a minimum standard grade deemed equivalent to a C or higher in the United States higher education system.

The total number of credits which may be applied from a foreign university is assessed in terms of the level of accreditation granted to the institution by the ministry of higher education in the country of origin. The total number of credits that may be applied to an Indiana State University baccalaureate degree cannot exceed 90.

Students transferring from institutions of higher education abroad with which Indiana State University has developed program articulations will receive transfer credit in accordance with the provisions of the articulated program agreement.

210.11 Readmission of Former Students. Former Indiana State University students who have interrupted their studies for more than two calendar years must apply for readmission through the Office of Admissions. Applicants for readmission are required to disclose registration at any college or university and to submit official transcripts documenting that registration as a condition for readmission. Failure to disclose attempted course work at other colleges or universities constitutes fraud upon the University.

210.11.1 Unconditional Readmission. Students who have maintained at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average at the other institutions and left Indiana State University in good academic standing are eligible for unconditional readmission.

210.11.2 Readmission on Probation. Applications from students who were academically dismissed from Indiana State University will be reviewed in the Office of Admissions and by the academic dean of the college of the student's intended major. Former degree-seeking students cannot enroll as non-degree students if they are on academic probation or have been academically dismissed. No student may be readmitted if academically dismissed three times. Applications from students who left ISU in good standing, but experienced academic difficulty at a different institution will also be reviewed by the academic dean of the college of the student's intended major. Students readmitted on academic probation are expected to earn the required minimum grade point average in their first return term or are subject to academic dismissal.

210.12 Academic Renewal. Indiana State University provides Academic Renewal as an option to returning student applicants who have been out of school for a significant period of time and whose previous academic performance is not indicative of the academic work of which they are now capable. Academic Renewal recognizes that such students are often hampered by a previous, low grade point average, and it offers them the opportunity to use only those classes, taken after readmission, in the computation of their Indiana State University grade point average. The following conditions apply:

1. Five or more years must have passed between the student's previous ISU enrollment and the current term of readmission and the student must not have earned a degree from ISU;

2. Academic Renewal is granted only after completion of a minimum of 12 credits with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher;
3. Academic Renewal can occur only once, and it is irreversible.
4. Students' Indiana State University transcripts will indicate that Academic Renewal has been granted. All courses and grades will remain on the transcript.
5. If Academic Renewal is granted, students' cumulative grade point average will be computed from courses taken since readmission. (To determine graduation with honors, however, classes before readmission will still be included in grade point average calculation.)
6. All academic requirements in place at the time of readmission must be met.
7. Students' academic dean will review students' previous Indiana State University transcripts and determine the applicability of Indiana State University courses that carry a grade of C or higher to the current degree program. These credits will count toward the students' total earned credits but will not be calculated in students' grade point average.
8. Students must complete at least 30 credits of Indiana State University course work after readmission to earn a degree.

To apply for Academic Renewal, students should consult their academic dean.

210.13 Continuing Student Taking Courses outside ISU.

Continuing students who attempt additional course work at colleges or universities other than Indiana State are required to promptly submit official transcripts documenting those attempts. Failure to disclose attempted course work at other colleges or universities constitutes fraud upon the University.

The University welcomes those who wish to enroll without intending to pursue a degree program at ISU. While such individuals are expected to satisfy admission requirements, they are not ordinarily asked to provide academic credentials from high school or previous colleges. Non-degree students needing to enroll in a course that has a pre-requisite requirement must submit official transcripts indicating successful completion of prerequisite course.

Non-degree students must complete the on-line application for non-degree study before the beginning of each term of their intended enrollment. Non-degree students may complete registration on-line. Registration is determined upon a space available basis. The Office of Admissions may require high school or college transcripts from individuals who repeatedly enroll as non-degree students if continued enrollment suggests the pursuit of a degree program. International students seeking non-degree admission must submit an official academic transcript(s), English proficiency, and a copy of a visa or passport. Students are limited to no more than six semester credits for any given term while in non-degree status. Non-Degree students must apply for admission each term in which they wish to enroll. Non-degree students are not eligible for federal financial aid consideration.

Credits earned in non-degree status may later be applied to a degree program, but the University cannot guarantee their applicability until such students have been admitted to the University. Consequently, persons wishing to pursue degree programs as part-time students must complete a regular admission application and submit official transcripts from schools and colleges previously attended.

Recommendation: Approve the modifications to Policy 210.5.3.

3e Name Change to Department of Applied Clinical and Educational Sciences (ACES)

The Department of Communication Disorders and Counseling, School, and Educational Psychology (CDCSEP) proposed to change its name to the shorter name of Department of Applied Clinical and Educational Sciences (ACES). When the three departments of Counseling, Communication Disorders, and Educational and School Psychology first merged, the faculty had sought a shorter name, but none could be agreed to at that time. The department has now come to agree upon this shorter, easier to manage name that encompasses the programs a minor in Counseling, BS in Speech Language Pathology, M.Ed. in School Counseling, MS in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, MS in Speech-Language Pathology, Ed.S. in School Psychology, and Ph.D.'s in Counselor Education and School Psychology.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean and the Faculty of the Bayh College of Education, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: That the name change to Department of Applied Clinical and Educational Sciences (ACES) be approved, effective Fall 2019.

3f Name Change to School of Criminology and Security Studies

The Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice and the College of Arts & Sciences proposed to establish a School of Criminology and Security Studies in place of the current department. The department chair will be renamed Director and assume all normal responsibilities. The MS and BS in Criminology and Criminal Justice, BS in Intelligence Analysis, and BS in Cybercriminology and Security Studies will remain in the school.

There are three main reasons for the proposal: 1) marketing and recruitment of students and faculty; 2) fundraising, scholarships, and community outreach; and 3) academic distinctiveness.

For marketing and recruitment, the current department name does not adequately represent the range of the new programs. Contacts with people in the field of security studies and intelligence analysis are confused why these programs are within a criminal justice department. The name of the department is also causing confusion with faculty recruitment. With fundraising, scholarships, and community outreach, the broader name of the school will allow the School to be clearer on the range of programs and how broadly the resources can be used (i.e. beyond criminology programs). Finally, a School of Criminology and Security Studies aligns the graduate program better with like programs (and therefore assist recruiting of top students), and aligns our programs with other universities that have a distinct school name.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean and the Faculty of the College of Arts & Sciences, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: That the name change to School of Criminology and Security Studies be approved, effective Fall 2019.

3g New Program Deaf/Hard of Hearing Licensure Program

Indiana State University proposes to offer the Deaf/Hard of Hearing Licensure Program designed to prepare teachers to work with students who are deaf or hard of hearing. The program is made possible by the Promoting Achievement for Students with Sensory Loss (PASS) grant which is funded by the Indiana Department of Education through the Blumberg Center.

This 20 credit-hour program may be completed in 24 months of study. Students begin in spring and follow the program sequence (spring: 3 credits; summer: 3 credits; fall: 3 credits; spring: 3 credits; summer: 3 credits; and fall: 5 credits.)

The DHH licensure program was developed at the request of the Indiana Department of Education, Office of Special Education. There is a critical shortage of DHH teachers nationwide and Indiana is no exception. This program will be a pipeline for certified teachers to complete the needed courses leading to DHH licensure.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean and the Faculty of the Bayh College of Education, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: That the Deaf/Hard of Hearing Licensure Program, in the Bayh College of Education, be approved effective fall 2019.

3h New Program Forensic Sciences Minor

Students who pursue this minor develop foundational understanding that prepares them for future study to become forensic laboratory technicians and medical examiners. This minor incorporates coursework in anthropology, chemistry, and biology.

Over the past year 6 students have proposed an MST minor in Forensic Sciences, indicating interest in a program of study that prepares students with a broad understanding of the field of forensic science. As a multidisciplinary program of study, this minor incorporates coursework in anthropology (Earth and Environmental Systems), Chemistry, and Biology.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: Approval of the new program, Forensic Sciences Minor, effective fall 2019.

3i New Program Entertainment Design and Technology Minor

The Department of Theater requests approval for a new Minor in Entertainment Design and Technology. The new minor program will be a unique course of study tailored towards students with an interest in theater and entertainment design and technology, but for whom a comprehensive major in theater is not appropriate or possible. It will be structured in such a manner that students from across the university will be able to explore skills and practices suited towards in-demand careers in the entertainment industry, while still earning a bachelor's degree in another discipline.

The curriculum for the Minor in Entertainment Design and Technology will require completion of 27 credit hours, which is on parity with the number of credits required to complete the department's currently offered two minors. These credits are drawn from courses currently offered as part of the design and technology concentration in the department of Theater, as well as the option to include coursework from a variety of related disciplines across campus.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: Approval of the new program, Entertainment Design and Technology Minor, effective fall 2019.

3j New Program Humanities for Health and Medical Professionals Minor

With the increasing focus on career-readiness at ISU, this minor will serve as a useful tool in the job application materials of ISU graduates seeking employment in the field of healthcare or admission to graduate programs in clinical ethics/bioethics, humanities and the behavioral and social sciences, or professional programs in healthcare. Second, the minor will provide students with a substantive overview of the intersection of the liberal arts (especially history, communication, and philosophy), the social and behavioral sciences, and healthcare and medicine. A third benefit of this minor is the wide range of students to whom it would apply. For example, this minor would be an excellent complement to the programs of study in nursing and pre-medicine, as well as those in the fields of athletic training, public health, health administration, and many other health-related majors available at ISU. Another advantage of this minor, deriving from the previous benefit, is the opportunity it would provide faculty and students to collaborate across colleges, to introduce students to the wide range of health and health-related resources at ISU, and to draw more students in the field of health and human services into the liberal arts and social and behavioral sciences in a very practical way.

The proposal has been approved by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Faculty Senate, and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: Approval of the new program, Humanities for Health and Medical Professionals Minor, effective fall 2019.

3k Academic Calendar for 20-21 and 21-22 Academic Years

The Academic Calendar sets schedules for the beginning and end points of each semester, as well as setting important dates throughout the semesters, such as add/drop deadlines, attendance and interim grade reporting dates, breaks, and finals weeks. For planning purposes, calendars are set for two- year cycles. The proposed calendar has been approved by the Faculty Senate and has the support of the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Recommendation: Approve the proposed Academic Calendar for the 20-21 and 21-22 academic years.

3l Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statements

Rationale: Indiana law and Policy 912 Conflicts of Interest require disclosure of conflicts of a pecuniary interest of \$250 or more to the ISU Board of Trustees in writing before any transaction takes place. A "pecuniary interest" is defined as "an interest in a contract or purchase if the contract or purchase will result or is intended to result in an ascertainable increase in the income or net worth" of the ISU employee or a dependent/spouse of the ISU employee. ISU also annually requests members of the Board of Trustees, the President, and the President's Cabinet to complete annual conflict of interest disclosures statements.

Recommendation: Acceptance of the Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statements.

3m Appointment of Nominating Committee by Board Chair

The Board of Trustees Nominating Committee will meet prior to the June 21st Organizational Meeting of the Board to nominate a slate of officers for 2019-2020 for the board's consideration. The slate will include nominees for the roles of chair, vice chair, secretary, and assistant secretary. The Board will also appoint the University treasurer and a trustee to serve as an Ex-Officio member of the ISU Foundation Board.

Recommendation: Appointment of Nominating Committee by Board Chair Ed Pease.

3n Update on Strategic Plan Key Performance Indicator Targets

3o Health and Wellness Fee

There has been a dramatic spike in the increase for demand of mental health services during the ten-year time frame between the 2007-2008 and 2017-2018 academic years at Indiana State University, but also across college campus throughout the country. In all, there has been a 92% increase in that demand at ISU. In the same time span, ISU's enrollment grew by 23%. Increase in demand for services grew at nearly four times the rate of student enrollment. Waiting periods for students to see a counselor continue to increase because of this demand, sometimes waiting eight weeks for their first appointment. With students' waiting longer periods of time to have an appointment with the Student Counseling Center, it is reasonable to believe that students' situations will undoubtedly escalate due to their wellbeing unaddressed. Therefore, the number of crises appointments the Student Counseling Center sees continue to increase. The ISU campus created Sycamores Care in 2016 to address student wellbeing, but they too are overwhelmed with students in need.

To reduce these difficulties, Student Government Association proposed to the student body a \$75.00 Student Health and Wellness Fee, which was:

Do you support the creation of a \$75.00 semesterly health and wellness fee that will provide more access to mental health services for students, as well as additional resources and training for students,

staff, and faculty for the purpose of improving overall health and wellness on campus? This health and wellness fee would be paid for by students' financial aid packages.

Students voted on this fee on March 5 and 6, 2019. The final vote total was:

If implemented, the fee would be structured the same as the Student Recreation Fee, which impacts students who are enrolled in six or more credit hours on-campus in the fall and spring semesters. Students enrolled in 3 or more on-campus credit hours in the summer would be assessed a \$35 fee. The SGA proposal recommends that revenue generated from the health and wellness fee go to hiring more staff for the Student Counseling Center, Student Health Promotion, and Sycamores Care to help with student wellbeing. Other parts of the revenue will be used for both mental health training for students, staff, and faculty and health and wellness programming. If implemented, the fee would not be effective until fall 2020.

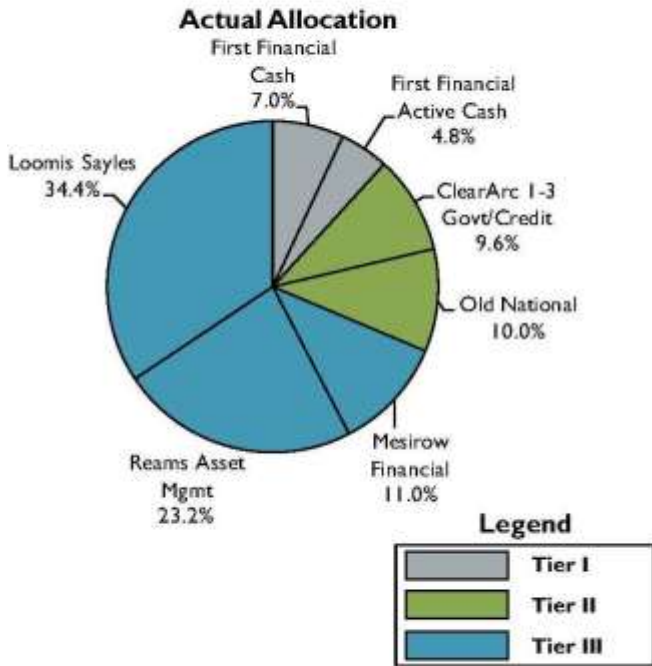

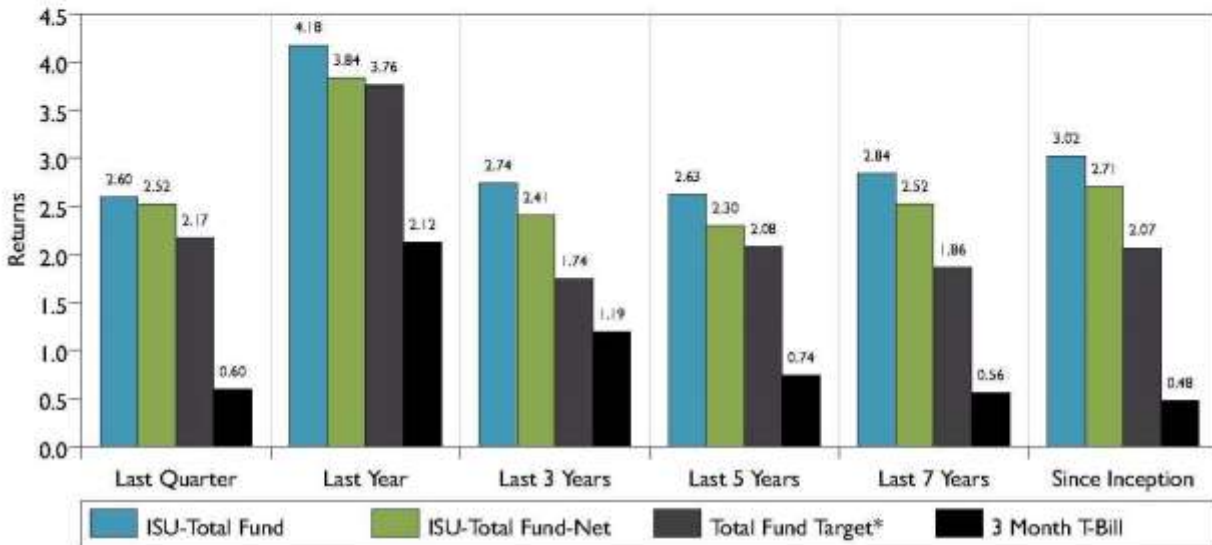

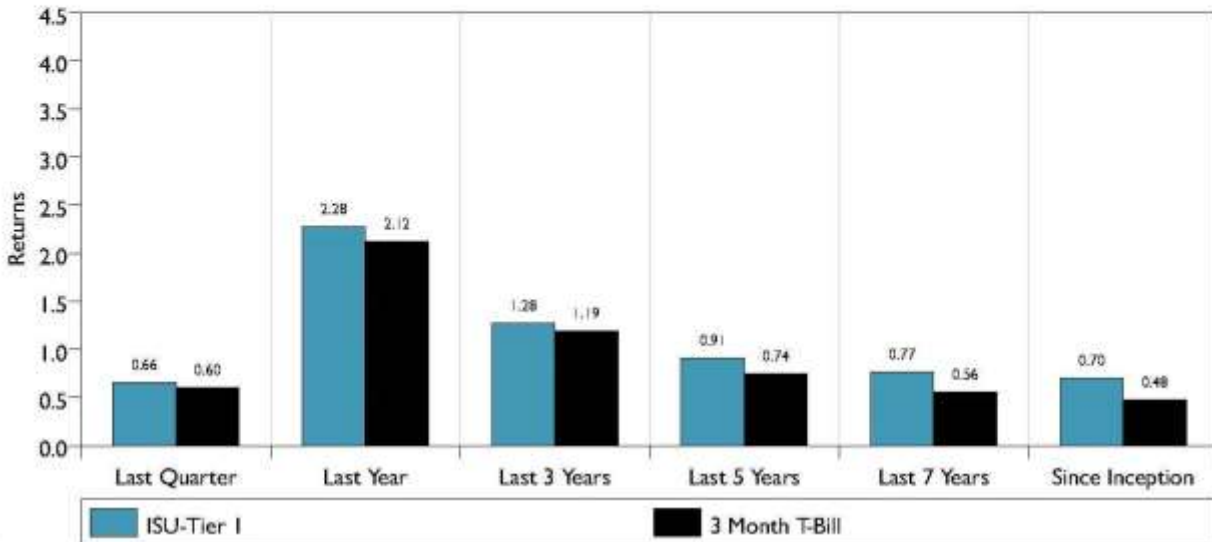

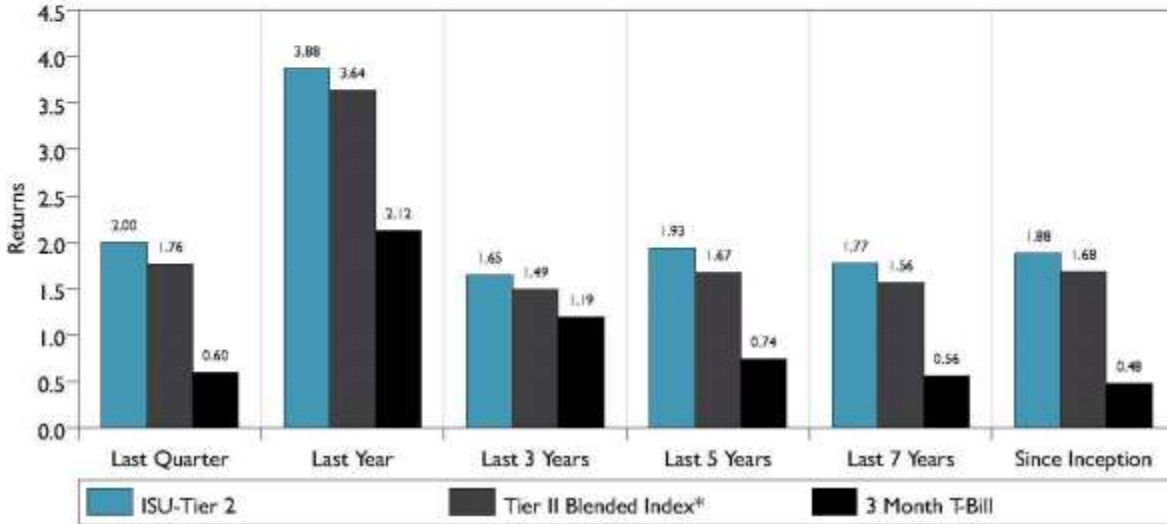

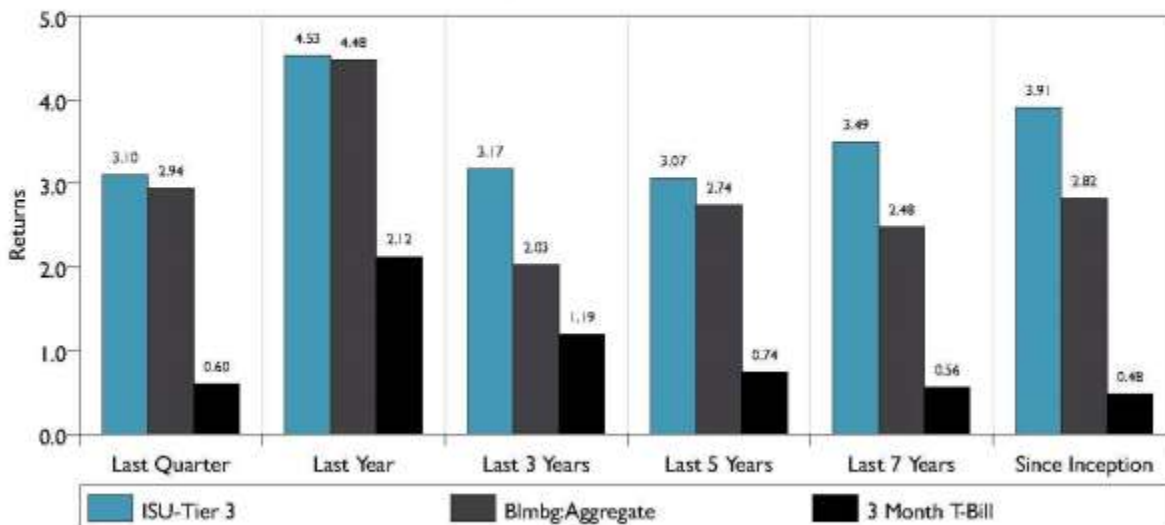

Revenues

Student Tuition

Fall semester tuition of \$46.7 million is below budget by \$4.0 million and Spring semester tuition of \$42.4 million is also below budget by \$4.0 million. The University has budgeted \$5.4 million as a reserve to offset this shortfall along with implementing a 3% reserve on all general fund supply and expense, repair and maintenance, and capital budgets. Summer school tuition totals \$4.4 million which reflects only the second half of summer as this crosses fiscal years with the remaining tuition income for summer to be recognized before June 30, 2019.

Other Fees and Charges

Other Fees and Charges are below last year's amount by \$204,175. This reflects reduced college challenge enrollment revenue, change of course fees, deferment fees, collection fees and undergraduate and graduate application fees. Included in this category are program fees of \$762,870 which represents the amount charged for the Fall and Spring semesters and the amount of Summer 2018 recognized in FY19. There will be Summer 2019 fees that are to be recognized before June 30, 2019. These fees are allocated to designated funds in which expenditures for these programs are recorded. The programs represented in these fees include: Doctor of Nursing Practice, Physician Assistant, Occupational Therapy, Doctor of Physical Therapy, Communication Disorders, Genetic Counseling, and Doctor and Masters in Athletic Training.

Other Income and Transfers

Other Income and Transfers are above last year's totals by \$707,680. This reflects an increase of \$182,000 of utility reimbursement by Residential Life and includes \$456,000 of interest income allocated through 3/31/19 of the \$608,000 budgeted for the year. The interest income represents the portion of the Scott College of Business and the Hulman Center project not funded by fee replacement. The full debt service for these bond issues are shown in the Academic Debt Service expenditures category below.

Reimbursements and Income Reappropriated from Other Sources

Income from these sources are down \$1,092,925 from the prior fiscal year. This includes the \$762,870 reclassified program fees listed above. The remaining decrease is a result of reduced lab fees, international sponsored student fees, new student orientation fees, one-time funding for the State Works Program allocated in the previous year.

Expenses

Compensation

Compensation Expense is above last year's total by \$975,290. This is inclusive of a 1.5% salary increase effective November 1. Salaries and Wages are up \$897,686 to reflect increased administrative and support wages while instructional and graduate assistant wages decreased. Fringe benefits increased by \$77,604 due to increased medical insurance, TIAA, PERF, disability, and FICA costs that were offset by reductions in retirement incentives.

Departmental Expenses

Departmental Expenses increased \$936,899 from last year. Supplies and Related Expenses increased by \$211,164 which reflects timing of the unified telecommunications charge. Repairs and Maintenance expenses are above last year's total by \$461,056 reflecting the timing of purchase orders for HVAC, building maintenance and OIT computer software. Other Committed Expenses are up by \$264,229 as a result of increased control systems expenses, timing of fire protection payments, and increased insurance premiums.

Utilities and Related Expenses

Utilities and Related Expenses are above last year's total by \$226,906. Increased costs in electricity, sewage, and water have offset natural gas savings.

Equipment and Other Capital

Equipment and Other Capital expenditures are below last year's total by \$3,488,504. Library Acquisition shows an increase of \$448,402. This is a result of recording purchases orders at the beginning of the fiscal year on subscription services used by the Library rather than using direct pay only as in the prior year. Operating Equipment shows a decrease of \$1,287,147 to reflect a decrease in OIT and Facilities Management capital purchases. Capital Improvements are down \$2,649,759 from last year reflecting timing differences in transfers.

Student Scholarship and Fee Remissions

Student Scholarship and Fee Remissions are above last year's total by \$845,750. The growth in scholarships reflects a change that started in FY18 in eligibility criteria for merit based aid and the addition of an Illinois scholarship program. The Laptop scholarships were at the same level as 2018 expenditures which will result in a \$207,832 year-end reversion.

Academic Debt Service

Academic Debt Service is budgeted at \$12.3 million for 2019 and shows a \$3.2 million increase from 2018. This reflects the additional fee-replaced and non-fee-replaced debt service for the Human Center project and the non-fee-replaced debt for the Scott College of Business. The non-fee replaced portion of debt service is funded by interest income and is reflected in the Other Income and Transfers listed above.

Budgeted Reserve

The budget reserve will be used to offset the tuition revenue shortfall and student scholarship and fee remissions. An additional \$700,000 of the current operating FY19 budget has been reserved to apply toward the revenue shortfall.

Transfers Out

Transfers Out increased by \$966,482. This reflects an increase of a loan payback recorded in the subsidiary ledger in 2019 and timing of the RHIC simulation transfer. This category also includes program fees that are transferred to designated funds in which they are expended. These programs include Physician Assistant, Occupational Therapy, Doctor of Physical Therapy, Doctor of Nursing Practice, Communication Disorders, Genetic Counseling, and Doctor and Masters of Athletic Training.
